IMMUNIZATIONS

453.2

The District is responsible to see that all children entering a Wisconsin public school for the first time be immunized against diphtheria, mumps, tetanus, hepatitis B, chicken pox, pertussis, polio, measles and rubella. The superintendent or Board may delegate certain tasks to other school employees (i.e. teachers, clerks, school nurses) but the responsibility for compliance with these requirements is shared with local public health agencies.

Immunization requirements may be waived for the student, if an adult, or the student's parent/guardian submits a written statement to the school objecting to the reasons of health, religion or personal conviction.

The District is to provide an immunization plan to the Department of Health and Family Services annually by September 1. The Director of Student Services shall be responsible for submitting this plan.
