WAUNAKEE COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT SCHOOL SOCIAL WORKER Job Description

QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1. Appropriate certification required by the Department of Public Instruction.
- 2. Any other qualifications as the Board of Education deems necessary.

OVERVIEW:

The school social worker, supervised by the Director of Student Services, is an advocate for educational equity, promotes the healthy development and well-being of the whole child and their family, and is a leader for systemic change within their school community.

SPECIFIC DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Guiding Principles

The social worker will:

- 1. Provide a critical link between school, home, and community to secure equitable education opportunities; increase students' ability to be mentally, physically, and emotionally present in the classroom; and promote respect and dignity for all students and their families.
- 2. Align practice with the NASW School Social Work Code of Ethics.
- 3. Possess and utilize knowledge of local, state and federal laws/policies in order to enhance service delivery and to ensure informed practice.
- 4. Advocate at multiple systemic levels to challenge social, racial, and economic injustice, to reduce barriers, and to promote positive outcomes.
- 5. Use a variety of data sources to understand the larger issues impacting students and families in the community.
- 6. Engage in ongoing learning to advance knowledge and practice, including membership in professional associations.

Direct Service and Intervention

The social worker will:

- 1. Develop and utilize needs assessments to guide practice at student, family, school, and community levels.
- 2. Coordinate and provide support for child abuse prevention, and suspected child abuse and neglect reporting.
- 3. Provide support, communication, referrals, education, skill development, and other social work services to families through a variety of methods including home visits.
- 4. Apply culturally responsive, trauma-sensitive, strengths-based, and evidence-based interventions within a multilevel system of support.

- 5. Conduct social and developmental histories and assess family functioning as needed for referred students.
- 6. Provide crisis management and support including real-time response and intervention.

Collaboration

The social worker will:

- 1. Consult with colleagues, community resources, and interagency teams, such as Joining Forces for Families, to improve student and family outcomes.
- 2. Build linkages and networks by strengthening lines of communication among students, parents/guardians, school, and community.
- 3. Partner with students and families to provide resources and referrals that match needs, leading to better outcomes.
- 4. Communicate information with a variety of audiences.
- 5. Serve as a member of school teams as needed to provide support and assistance to students and families.
- 6. Offer educational and skill development for staff.

Other Duties

The social worker will:

- 1. Conduct evaluation of social work programming and services.
- 2. Perform all other duties as assigned by the Director of Student Services or the superintendent.
