THE POLICY

The Salt Lake City School District Board of Education is committed to providing safe and efficient school bus transportation to its students in accordance with all applicable state and federal laws and regulations.

The purpose of this policy is to provide all eligible students with safe district transportation to and from school and school-sponsored activities.

The board prefers the use of school buses or appropriately insured commercial vehicles to transport students to and from off-campus activities and field trips, both during and outside of regular school hours. While not preferred, private or rental vehicles may also be used in accordance with the requirements outlined in the G-8: Administrative Procedures. The board may authorize additional student transportation options in special circumstances.

The district has set forth its specific processes for implementing this board policy through the accompanying <u>administrative</u> procedures.

No district employee or student shall be subjected to discrimination in employment or any district program or activity on the basis of age, color, disability, gender, gender identity, genetic information, national origin, pregnancy, race, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or veteran status.
