DEVELOP A HIGH SCHOOL & BEYOND PLAN





- Students start the HSBP in middle school, where they create a plan that builds toward a diploma and their long-term goals.
- Students outline how they will meet the high school graduation requirements and what they want to do after graduation.
- Student adjusts their plan throughout high school, based on changing interests and goals.
- The plan is shared with parents/guardians during the annual student-led conferences.

SMARTER BALANCED ASSESSMENTS

Meet or exceed the graduation scores in the Smarter Balanced Assessments (SBA) in English language arts (ELA) and mathematics.



DUAL CREDIT

Earn at least one high school credit in ELA and at least one high school credit in math in dual credit courses (Running Start, College in the High School, and Career and Technical Education dual credit courses).



AP/IB

For both ELA and math, earn a 3 or higher on certain Advanced Placement (AP) exams or a 4 or higher on certain International Baccalaureate (IB) exams.



SAT/ACT

Meet or exceed the graduation scores set by SBE in the math and ELA portions of the SAT or ACT.

Meet standard on the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) by scoring at least the minimum established by the military for eligibility to serve in a branch of the armed services. (Score = 31)






CTE SEQUENCE

Complete a sequence of Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses: two or more high school credits of CTE courses in a progression tailored to the student's goals and relevant to the postsecondary pathway(s) outlined in the student's High School and Beyond Plan. The sequence may be comprised of courses within the same CTE program area or courses within more than one CTE program area.

- Watch the Promotional Tri-Tech video on the SHS/TT website to hear about all the programs.
- Tri-Tech is 3 periods program (3 periods at Tri-Tech and 3 periods at SHS).
- Transportation back and forth is included and lunch is offered onsite for convenience.
- Limited spots are available in each program (spots go to seniors first then juniors)
- Some programs are one year and some have a two year option.

- Programs can give you equivalency credits and college credits
- Online application must be completed during registration week.
- During SHS registration: Sign up for 6 classes at SHS and choose "Tri-Tech Holding AM or PM" as your alternate.
- You will hear from Tri-Tech in April If you are accepted. At that point we will change PS schedule.

COLLEGE in the HIGH SCHOOL



- Earn college credit from CWU or U of W while taking a course at Southridge
- Must meet eligibility requirement from the institution offering college credit (test in Writing, Reading and/or Math)
- Credits placed on high school transcript and college transcript.
- Students pay the college for courses at a reduced rate
 = \$175 / 5cr (cost varies)
