NATIONAL SCHOOL NURSE DAY WEDNESDAY, MAY 11, 2022

Over the last two years, the role of the School Nurse has been amplified by COVID 19. The pandemic has truly illustrated how school nursing is so strongly rooted in Public Health. School Health is a specialized practice of nursing, in which school nurses link healthcare and education. With the goal to optimize health and safety while the student is learning.

School nurses are often looked upon as that person who takes care of headaches, stomach aches and skinned knees and elbows, however that is minimal to what they really do. The Individuals with Disabilities Educational Act (IDEA) is a law that makes available free and appropriate public education to eligible children with disabilities, and therefore brings students into school from diverse family, cultural and economic circumstances regardless of their handicapping conditions. Children with health conditions that may have been fatal early in life are now surviving, growing, and attending school. These children often have specialized health needs during school hours, requiring highly skilled and complex care, such as G-tube feedings, urinary catheterization, respiratory care, and injectable medications. While some of these tasks can be delegated to education staff, it requires a healthcare professional to provide that "non-healthcare provider" the necessary education and training as well as someone to oversee and monitor progress.
