- Apply For Running Start Admission
 - Applications are OPEN!!
 - Submit Unofficial High School Transcripts Via Email
 - Students Will Be Emailed FERPA and Parent Permission Form
 - Acceptance Letters Will Be Emailed April 11th
- Once Admitted
 - Students MUST Complete Placement Exams
 - Advise and Prepare For Enrollment
 - Online Orientation
 - Selection of Courses
 - Submission of Enrollment Verification Form (EVF)
