Admission

Automatic Admission above a 3.5 GPA

3.30-3.49 GPA are reviewed on individual basis:

- Personal Statement
- Recommendation Letter
- PSAT, ACT, PLAN
 - PSAT scores below 75th percentile are rarely accepted.
