

## Stamford Public Schools Embarks on Long-Term Strategic Planning Process

Stamford, Conn.— Stamford Public Schools (SPS) began its long-term visioning and strategic planning process in partnership with Cambridge Education, a management consulting organization specializing in school improvement and education change management. With input and guidance from a broad range of stakeholders, the district will develop a long-range vision and a five-year plan to drive improvement across SPS. District strategic planning is being coordinated with the communitywide, United Way-sponsored, Cradle-to-Career collective impact initiative.

"Stamford Public Schools has a long and distinguished history of educating a wide variety of young people. Our challenge is to build on that solid foundation to achieve the next level of success for all students. Developing a strategic plan that can guide our district in achieving short- and longterm goals is essential for the success of our students, staff and community," said SPS Superintendent Earl Kim. "Achieving excellence for all is a huge undertaking and will not be accomplished overnight. However, with input from those inside and outside of our schools, and guidance of experts in the field, I am confident we will come away with a roadmap for attainable and sustainable success."

Cambridge Education conducted a District Quality Review (DQR) to establish a shared understanding of what is working and what needs improvement in the district. The review focuses on six specific areas: promoting positive outcomes for students; support for student learning; leadership and management; engagement of families, the community and other stakeholders; human and fiscal resources; and operational systems. The DQR also provides stakeholders with an understanding of how policies and practices within the district affect schools and classrooms.

Based on the outcome of the DQR, which concludes in early February, the district will develop an aspirational vision and mission. Guided by that vision, mission, and a progression of achievable benchmarks, a tight strategic plan focused on core improvement strategies will be developed. Following is the expected timeline:

January – February:	District Quality Review
February:	Creating a vision for Stamford Public Schools
March—April:	Strategic planning activities with stakeholders at district and school levels
