Wayne County Schools Food Nutrition Department continues to be concerned about child nutrition during the summer months, as well as during the school year.

Therefore, Wayne County Operation: Summer Meals will be welcoming children to various sites to help feed them this summer at no charge, courtesy of the federal government summer food service program. All children will be welcome to eat both breakfast and lunch at the Wayne County Middle School, located at 95 Champion Drive on the Wayne County Schools campus on Monday through Friday June 3-27 and July 1-11. These dates were selected to help accommodate the 21st Century Learning Program Summer Campers, as well as coordinating with the Monticello Independent School who notified students about the opportunities. Any other young people up to 18-years-old, who are not attending specific summer programs are encouraged to take advantage of the free service too. Breakfast will be served from 8:00 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. and lunch will be served from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in the Wayne County Middle School Cafeteria.
