



The health and safety decisions surrounding AOF's camps are guided by the standards of care, guidelines, and protocols set forth by medical science and public health experts such as the Centers for Disease Control, the State of Connecticut, and the Farmington Valley Health District. AOF will adjust the policies as the CDC, FVHD and the State of Connecticut update their policies and mandates.

- Any camper who feels ill should stay home until symptoms subside. If a child feels sick during the camp day, parents will be notified and the camper will be sent home.
