Marching Band – It's a Family

A Place Where Lifetime Friendships and Memories are Made

It happens like clockwork. Every year, two weeks before the start of school, the sound of snare drums pervades the grounds of Mead High School and Mt. Spokane High School telling you Marching Band season is underway. In the Mead School District we are very proud to have not one but two premier Marching Band programs.

Be apprised, however, this activity is not about marching down the street in a straight line (which they do), nor is it just about a football half-time show (which they also do). According to Marching Band directors Brandon Campbell and Sy Hovik it's a musical, athletic activity bringing more than 100 musicians and Color Guard members together with the ultimate goal of becoming "one big, synchronized, moving machine."

The season starts in mid-August with Band Camp where students learn teamwork and cohesiveness right out of the gate. It's a layering process that starts with the fundamentals - learning to move your feet in the right way and march with appropriate technique. It takes 3-4 days of separate marching and music rehearsals before students begin the process of stacking responsibilities. After that it requires countless hours of practice to perfect a Marching Band show.

Unlike athletic teams, in Marching Band everyone is a starter. There is no spare tuba player waiting on the sidelines for his or her opportunity to enter the game. Seniors mentor freshmen and this strong student leadership plays a critical role in the success of both the Mt. Spokane and Mead High programs.

"Marching Band is not a team. It transcends team and is a family," says Mead High drummer Gabriel Kennedy-Gibbens. At Mt. Spokane director Sy Hovik stresses the importance of enjoying the experience and building solid relationships and memories. "How we get better and grow as an ensemble isn't talent," says Mr. Hovik. "It's making sure each individual feels and understands they belong."

Expressing his appreciation for the district's support of band and the arts, Mead High director Brandon Campbell says, "I love that Marching Band is one of the many ways we provide students with the opportunity to be really successful at something they are passionate about." And Mr. Hovik adds, "I love the way the district approaches not just Marching Band but music in general - it's smart. We wouldn't have Marching Band without strong community support."



2018 Bond Projects – Site Work Begins March 2019

Just over one year ago the Mead community approved a Capital Facilities Bond to build a new elementary school, new middle school, new transportation co-op facility, new maintenance facility and new 4,500 seat outdoor stadium that will serve as the location for Mt. Spokane and Mead High home football games and soccer matches. Additionally, the stadium will provide our award winning Marching Band programs with performance and practice facilities.

During the past twelve months our Facilities & Planning Department has been very busy working with ALSC Architects to design each flagship project. We are pleased to report all of this hard work has paid off and, weather permitting, site work on all projects will start this month. Target completion date for all facilities is on or before the beginning of the 2020-21 school year.













Boundary Review Community Information Meetings

The Boundary Review Committee has met multiple times since September preparing a recommendation for changes to current elementary, middle and high school boundaries. Implementation of new boundaries will occur when our new elementary school and new middle school open in the Fall of 2020. The committee has carefully considered how best to adjust boundaries while minimizing the number of students relocated.

Retirement Announcement A Message from Superintendent Tom Rockefeller



It was with sincere thanks and appreciation to the entire Mead School District community that I submitted my Letter of Resignation to the Board of Directors on December 17, 2018, effective at the end of this school year.

It has been an honor and truly the highlight of my 41-year career in education to serve as Mead's superintendent for the past 13 years. During my tenure as superintendent I have been blessed to work with what I consider to be the finest educators and administrative team in our region and state . . . and along side a truly dedicated and supportive school board.

From 2006, when I started as superintendent, to today, the district has experienced significant student growth. Thanks to strong community support we passed bond measures in 2015 and 2018 that replaced Northwood Middle School, remodeled Midway & Shiloh Hills and will see the opening of a new elementary school, new middle school, new athletic/performing arts venue, new transportation co-op and new maintenance facility in the next 18 months.

The school board has retained NW Leadership Associates to assist in the search for an individual to serve as the new superintendent. The position is posted with a closing date of March 15, 2019. Finalist interviews will be April 9, 10 & 11 (one full day for each individual). On April 9, 10 & 11 the community is invited to Northwood Middle School, 6 pm in the library, to meet the candidate interviewing on that day. The board anticipates a new superintendent will be hired by mid-April with a start date of July 1, 2019.

This summer, when I walk away and retire from my dream job, I do so with confidence the Mead School District is well positioned to continue its tradition of providing the very best learning opportunities for all students. Again, thank you for the honor and privilege of serving the Mead community for the past 13 years.

Preliminary Interview Panel Seeking Volunteers
