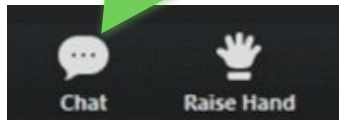

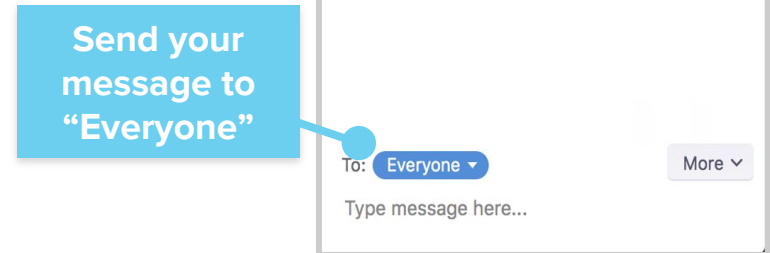
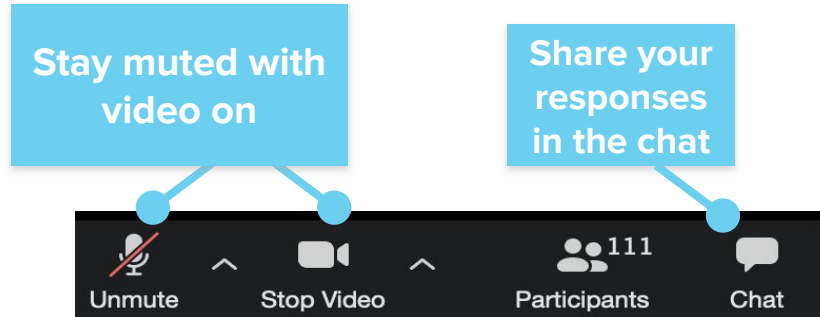

SEL is the process through which all young people and adults acquire and apply the knowledge, skills, and attitudes to develop healthy identities, manage emotions and achieve personal and collective goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain supportive relationships, and make responsible and caring decisions.

SEL advances educational equity and excellence through authentic school-family-community partnerships to establish learning environments and experiences that feature trusting and collaborative relationships, rigorous and meaningful curriculum and instruction, and ongoing evaluation. SEL can help address various forms of inequity and empower young people and adults to co-create thriving schools and contribute to safe, healthy, and just communities.

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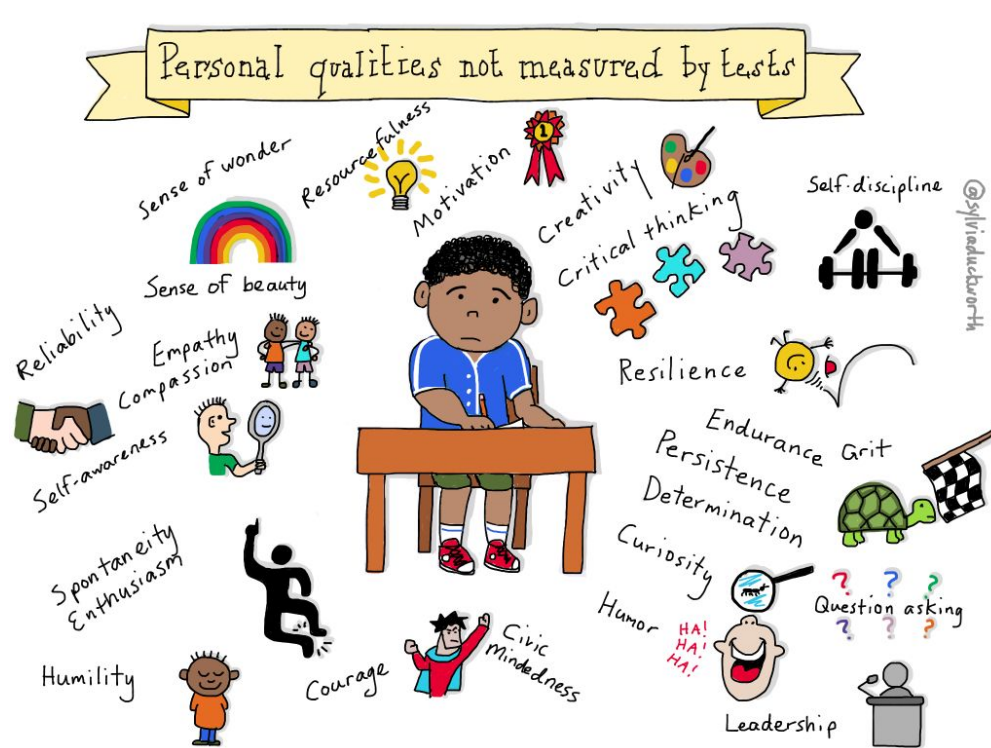

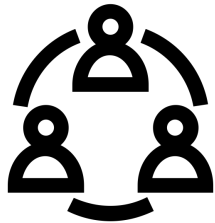


# Why It Matters

## Social Emotional Learning and **Attendance**

### DID YOU KNOW?

Highly engaged students are **57% less likely** to be **chronically absent** in school than students who report low engagement.



## Social Emotional Learning and **Behavior**

### DID YOU KNOW?

Students who report low Social Awareness are **2.5x more likely** to have one or more **behavior incidents** than students who report high Social Awareness.










## Social Emotional Learning and **Coursework**

### DID YOU KNOW?




Students who report high Self-Management are **75% less likely** to face **failing grades** than students who report low Self-Management.

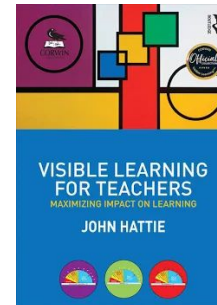

School-Related Factors		Effect Size
Collective Teacher Efficacy		1.39
Teacher-Student Relationships		0.52
Parental Involvement		0.45
School Climate		0.43
Principals/School Leaders		0.37
Teacher Professional Development		0.37
Home Visiting		0.29
Teacher Subject Matter Knowledge		0.23

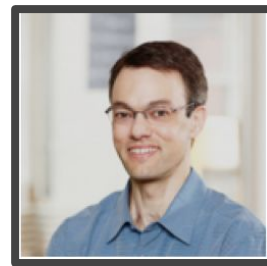

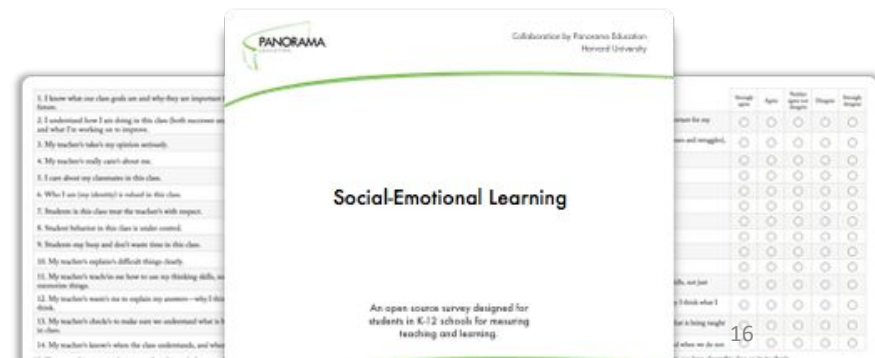
1. Literature Review & Expert Partnerships

6. Cognitive Pre-Testing
7. Piloting & Refinement



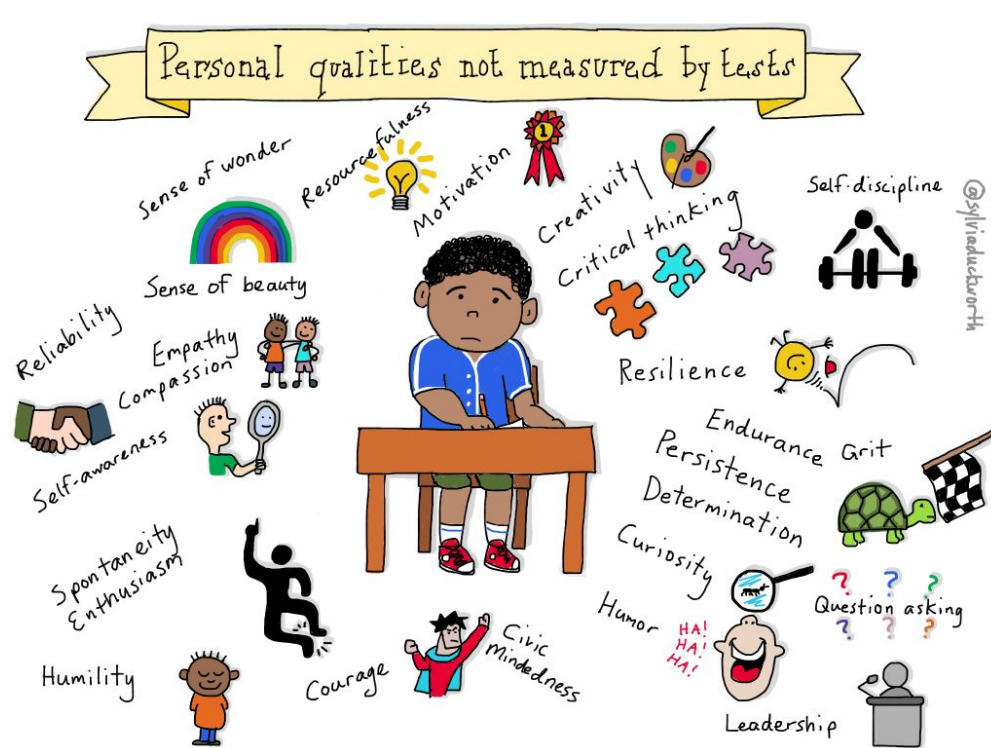

**74% more likely** to report using strategies to learn more effectively.

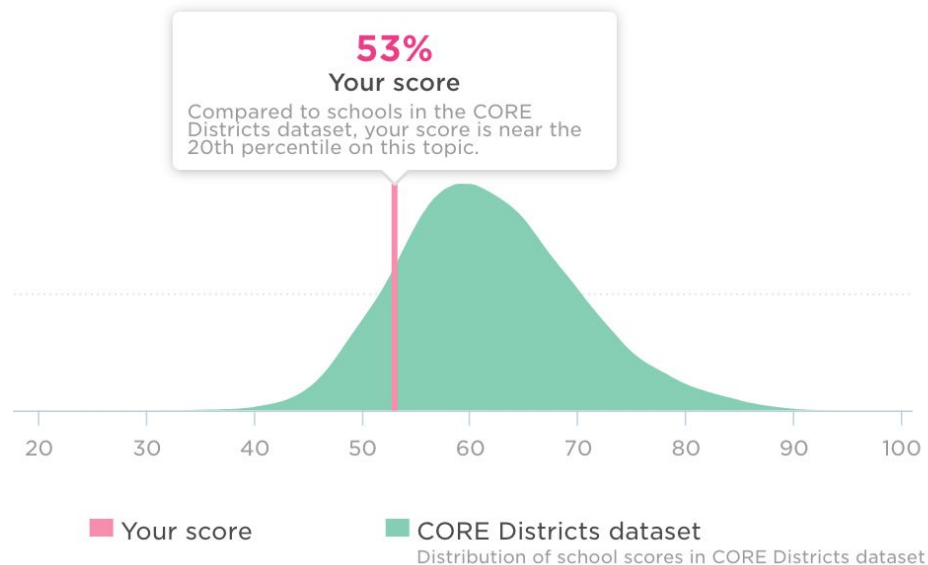
# 3x

When students believe their teachers encourage them to do their best, they are **three times more likely** to say they use ideas from school in their daily life.

# Long Beach USD

## *A Prioritized Focus on Growth Mindset*

After the first round of data collection, Long Beach noticed **strikingly** low results in Growth Mindset.



*MacArthur Elementary was falling in the **bottom quartile** compared to similar schools.*

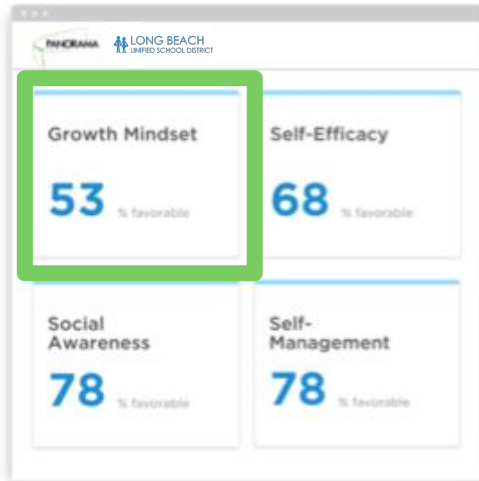

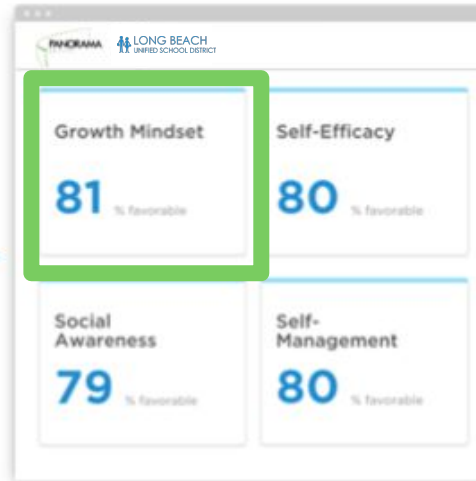

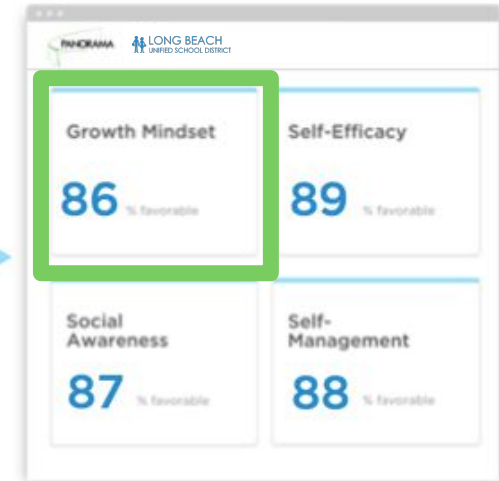

*As shown in the table above, MacArthur Elementary realized impressive gains in the percentage of students that met or exceeded standards in the two subject areas of the annual Smarter Balanced state assessment. This progress is especially notable in narrowing gaps between student groups, where gains in academic achievement were particularly profound during this time. These increases in students' academic achievement were in parallel with their increases in growth mindset on the social-emotional learning survey.*
