# A Letter to my St. James Family from The Reverend Kenneth White-Spunner







The voluntary for Sunday's services was composed by Larry King, Director of Music of Trinity Episcopal Church NYC in 1981. Here are notes from the composer:

RESURRECTION portrays in freely structured fragments the four aspects of the resurrection experience: Lament – The Rising – The Ecstasy – Reflection....

"Lament" combines the liturgical mourning of the plainsong Vinea me electa (O my vineyard, I planted and tended thee... and thou hast prepared a cross for thy Saviour) with a soulful expression of contemporary grief. "The Rising" grows quietly from this grief, using 12 tone rows and techniques to express its cosmic nature. "The Ecstasy" develops a populist alleluia strain with embellishments not unlike those used in the music of the Aquarian Age. "Reflection" combines the liturgical rejoicing of the plainsong introit for Easter Day Haec Dies (This is the day which the Lord has made) with the alleluia fragments.

The closing voluntary is an Improvisation by Charles Tournemire, organist of St. Sulpice in Paris. He did not write the score but it was recorded on wax cylinders and some years later Maurice Duruflé painstakingly transcribed them into written music while he listened to the recordings. The improvisation is based on the chant our choir sang this Easter, Victimae Paschali laudes "Christians, to the Paschal Victim, offer your thankful praises...."








# New Iron Work in Front of the Church



The Monday Night Women's Bible Study just began a new study, *Bad Girls of the Bible and What We Can Learn from Them*, by Liz Curtis Higgs. Ten of the Bible's infamous Bad Girls — Eve, Jezebel, Delilah, Lot's Wife, and more—point to a God who majors in mercy.

Popular storyteller Higgs takes a look at the "Bad Girls of the Bible," searching for the lessons these wicked women have to teach. Higgs retells these biblical stories with rollicking humor and deep insight as she teaches about the nature of sin and goodness. *Publishers Weekly*

Think you've gone too far? Done too much? Take heart. You're not alone. Eve had food issues. Potiphar's Wife and Delilah had man trouble. Lot's Wife and Michal couldn't let go of the past, Sapphira couldn't let go of money, and Jezebel couldn't let go of anything. Yet the Woman at the Well quenched her thirst for the truth, while Rahab and the Sinful Woman left their sordid histories behind.

The group will study the first five women then break for summer. Next fall the group will learn about the last five women. They begin at 6:30 PM in the Vestry Room in Green Hall, and usually finish around 8:10 PM.
