

Vestry Nominations

Kristofer Thomas Bradley

(Kris)—Born January 10, 1972 (46 years old) grew up in Fairhope, AL, graduating in 1990 from Fairhope High School. Attended Auburn University beginning in 1993, earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Forestry in 1997. He and his wife April have attended St. James since 1998 and were married there on November 6, 1999. They have two children, John Thomas (13) and Ella Catherine (9). Currently employed by Regions Bank as a Vice-President and Forester for the bank, having served in that capacity since 2004. In addition to being a member of the Alabama Banker's Association (served in many capacities on their Trust division board), he is licensed to practice professional forestry by the Alabama State Board of Registration for Forester. Kris also volunteers annually with the United Way, and has served as an usher for the past 10 years at St. lames.

Roger Guilian—Roger Guilian is both humbled and proud to have been asked to accept a fellow parishioner's nomination to serve on the Vestry of St. James Episcopal Church. Roger and his wife Leslie joined St. James in 2006. the University of Richmond with a degree in International Studies. Following graduation, Anderson moved to Mobile to work as Assistant Marketing Director for the Mobile Airport Authority. During that time, Anderson also received her MBA from Springhill College.

In 2001, Anderson married her husband, George McKean. They moved several times for George to complete his residency and fellowship, but ultimately settled in Fairhope to raise their three children; Trey (age 13), Madelyn (age 10), and Jack (age 10).

Anderson has served in a variety of leadership roles in the community. Second Sunday Evening Worship Service COMPLINE

Scripture, Singing, Silence January 13 7 pm in the Church

We hope you will make plans to join us in the Church on Sunday for Compline. From the Episcopal Church's website:

Compline is the last of the four services in the Daily Office. It is descended from the night prayers said before bed at the end of the monastic round of daily prayer. Compline is a simple office including a confession of sins, one or more psalms, a short reading from scripture, versicles and responses, the Lord's Prayer, collects which ask for God's protection during the night to come, and the canticle Nunc dimittis. A hymn for the evening may follow the short reading from scripture. The collects may be followed by a time of silence, along with free intercessions and thanksgivings.




Begins new study January 14

Joseph—the Journey to Forgiveness

Join us for our first study of 2019, Melissa Spoelstra's Joseph—the **Journey to Forgiveness.** The Monday Night Women's Bible Study will begin on Monday night, January 14, at 6:30 in the Vestry Room of Green Hall. The study books/ Kindle books may be purchased through Amazon.com, Christianbook.com, or Cokesbury.com. Prices vary (around \$12-\$14), but after adding shipping and taxes, there are small differences in the final price. Amazon offers "slightly used books" at a lower price. Melissa Spoelstra describes the study of Joseph in the following way:

All of us know what it's like to be hurt or betrayed. Often it's a small

breach such as being spoken to rudely or overlooked in a time of need. Other times we experience lies, gossip, or harsh words that cut us to the core. Some of us have endured unspeakable pain through abuse, adultery, or abandonment. God knows the pain we cause each other and longs to help us learn to practice forgiveness. Nowhere do we see forgiveness played out more fully in Scripture than in the biblical story of Joseph.



This six to twelve week study explores what God has to say to us about grace and forgiveness through Joseph's story of trial and

triumph found in Genesis 37-50. As we study his dreams, his betrayers, his dysfunctional family, his struggle to forgive, and his journey toward reconciliation, we'll find truths that echo into our own personal situations as well as practical help for answering common questions, such as: How do I stop dwelling on the hurt? Is forgiving someone excusing what happened? When will I stop having to re-forgive? Is there a difference between forgiveness and reconciliation? Can I forgive and still set boundaries? Is it ever okay not to forgive?



EXAMENPrayer for the Year

Do you practice a daily examen? This method of prayer helps us to reflect on a past period of time, usually the previous day. It is a form of prayer to

both reflect and let go. The same principles used in a daily examen can be used in an examen prayer for the year. To begin, all that is needed is a quiet, uninterrupted space.

Step One: Invite God

Ask the Holy Spirit to help you review your year with wisdom, grace and faith. Ask God to help you see both your failings and accomplishments throughout the year.

Step Two: Review the year with Gratitude

Notice moments of Grace and Love throughout the year. Thank God for the many gifts that you received as well as the gifts that you shared. These do not have to be big, dramatic gifts, but may be simple moments that you felt peaceful or joyful.

Step Three: Pay attention to your Emotions

What memories speak most loudly to you? What events, conversations, or activities bring up the most emotion? Ask God to help you linger with these emotions and ask for help in understanding why you feel as you do. What can you learn about yourself or your situation?

Step Four: Choose one part of the year and pray from it.

While you are thinking about memories and emotions, choose one. It may be a single event or pattern in behavior but whatever comes to mind allow it to begin your prayer. Do not worry about other events or aspects of your year. Stay with the one thing that comes to you and pray from those thoughts and emotions.

Step Five: Look toward the New Year

Now think and imagine what challenges and blessings may await you in 2019. Think of important relationships, major or minor decisions, skills to learn, habits to build, good work to accomplish. Make

a simple list and bring them to God. Ask for the graces that you will need.

End your prayer giving thanks to God's presence throughout your examen practice.

If you are interested in learning more about a daily examen practice, **Pray as You Go** podcast offers narrated daily Examens. These guides walk you through an examen process set to music. In addition to Pray as You Go Examens, the podcast offers powerful, prayerful way to start or end your day.

Podcasts are all around us and it seems

like everyone is listening to one or more. "Pray as you Go" is a great way to begin the day in prayer. Each



episode is around 10 minutes and includes a daily prayer that is accompanied by music. This podcast provides a framework for prayer and not a commentary. The app can be found on iTunes or Google play and is very user friendly.

Because of your contributions, we were able to spend almost a month distributing supplies from the church. We were able to serve hot meals every day for over three weeks to anyone who needed one. The pre-cooked meals you brought were probably the biggest hit of the entire first month. They fed a lot of people....
