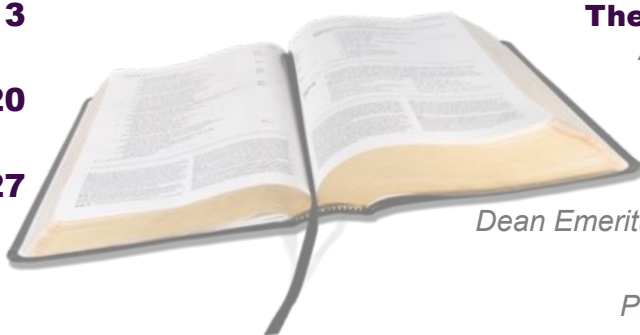

St. James Organ Tour

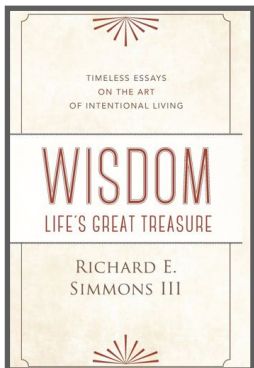
Monday, March 18, 2019 at 1:00 pm

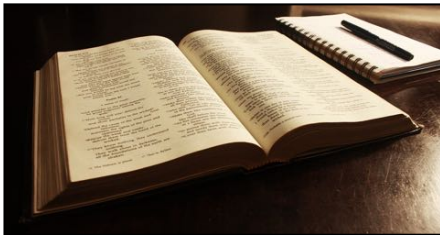
THE LENTEN SEASON

Christians are invited "to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word" (BCP, p. 265).

Listed below are some helpful ways for you and your family to "observe a holy Lent."

3 New Bible Studies

Beginning the Week of March 11



- ❖ **Mondays from 12-1 pm**, join Anne McEniry in the Vestry Room. Bring a brown bag lunch and discuss the final week of Jesus' earthly life, using the book *Entering the Passion of Jesus, a Guide to Holy Week*. All are welcome!

From the introduction:

The story of that last week [of Jesus' life] is often called the Passion narrative, with "passion" coming from an old Latin word meaning "to suffer" and "to endure." Jesus' suffering and death reveal to us how God's love works in the world. The Passion narrative is not only

about Jesus; it is about his followers as well, and so it is also about us.

- ❖ **Tuesday mornings from 7-8 am**, meet Arnold Bush in the Vestry Room to discuss the Lectionary. This study is for men only.
- ❖ **Thursday mornings from 7-8 am**, Mother Mary Jayne will lead a Bible Study for all on how the practice of repentance evolves over time. Meet in the Vestry Room.

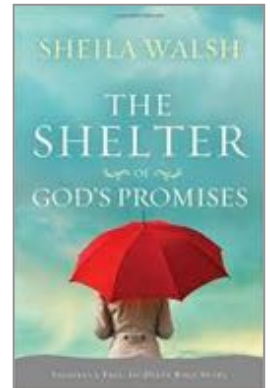

A Lenten Food Drive for Ecumenical Ministries For the Month of March It's as Easy as 1-2-3!

1. Pick up a grocery bag in Green Hall.
2. Fill it with non-perishable food items.
3. Return the filled bag to Green Hall anytime during the month of March. **Last day for drop off is Sunday, March 31.**

Critical Needs: Canned meats, cereal, peanut butter, jelly, meal-in-a-box (beef stew, pasta with meat, etc.), canned fruit, macaroni & cheese, pasta sauce, pork & beans, powdered milk

Ongoing needs: Oatmeal, grits, Cream of Wheat, canned & dry soups, dry pasta, dried beans, rice, muffin and biscuit mixes, coffee & tea, canned vegetables (preferably mixed vegetables, corn, carrots, potatoes, and beets. Green beans are not needed at this time).

These items cannot be purchased with food stamps and are always needed: paper towels, toilet tissue, dish detergent, diapers, baby wipes, bath soap, toiletries, toothpaste, toothbrushes, and first aid items.

Throughout the week, a clothing closet will be set up to distribute clothes to children and members of the congregation.

The group stays at the Methodist Center in Alajuela. It is a traditional dorm setup and we eat breakfast and dinner at the center. Members of the congregation provide lunch for us each day at the construction site.

Everyone works throughout the week, then has two fun days of sightseeing. Last year's trip included hiking and zip-lining through the rain forest.

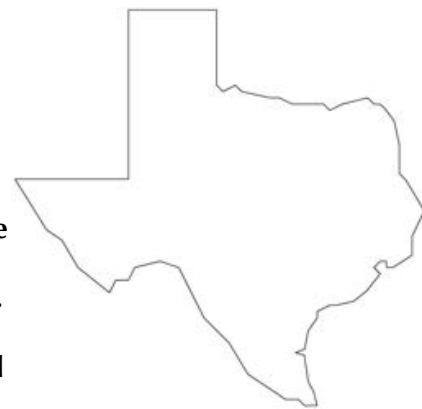

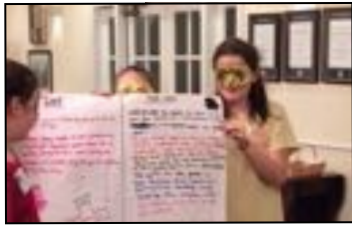

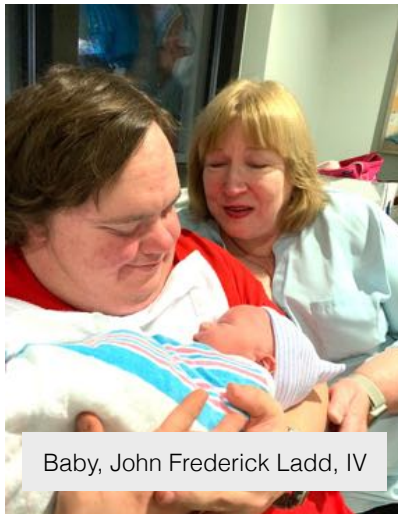
YouGroup

Riley sings in the Canterbury Choir and attends YouGroup with her parents.

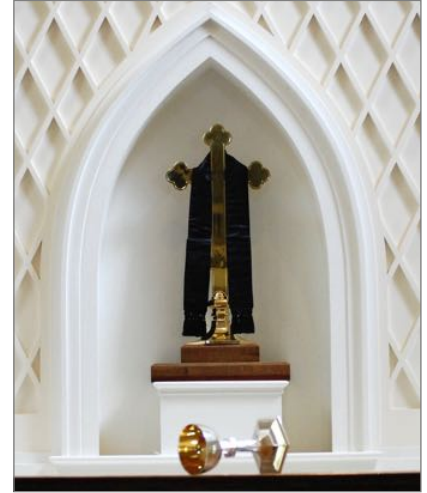
