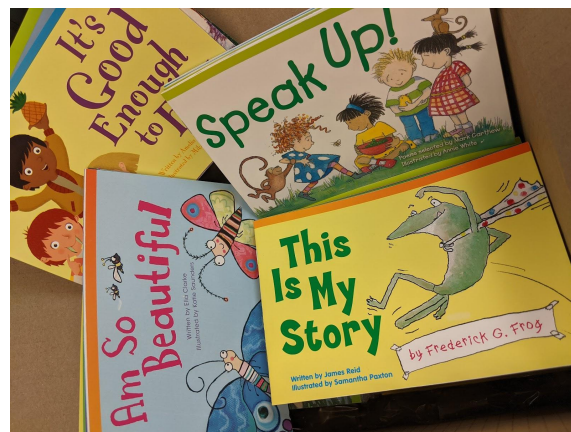
### 2021-2022 Library Use Averages

## Scholastic Book Fair

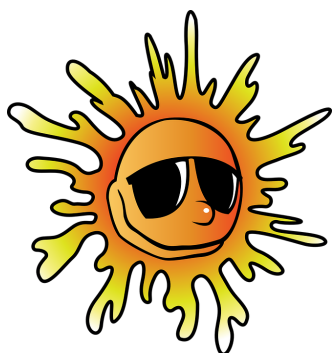

No cash, checks, or other forms of payment will be accepted due to our end-of-school year purchasing deadlines. Second, the fair will not be open during the school day. **It will be open 2:10 to 5:00 PM on Tuesday, May 24, and Wed. May 25, and 5:30 to 7:30 on Thursday, May 26.** Third, all books will be at regular prices. We thought we may get a BOGO fair, but none were available. Due to supply chain issues, Scholastic cannot guarantee books being in stock. However, we have obtained one free book for each student from Donors Choose, PBS Utah, and SLCSD and will give during the school day.
