Superintendent's Message





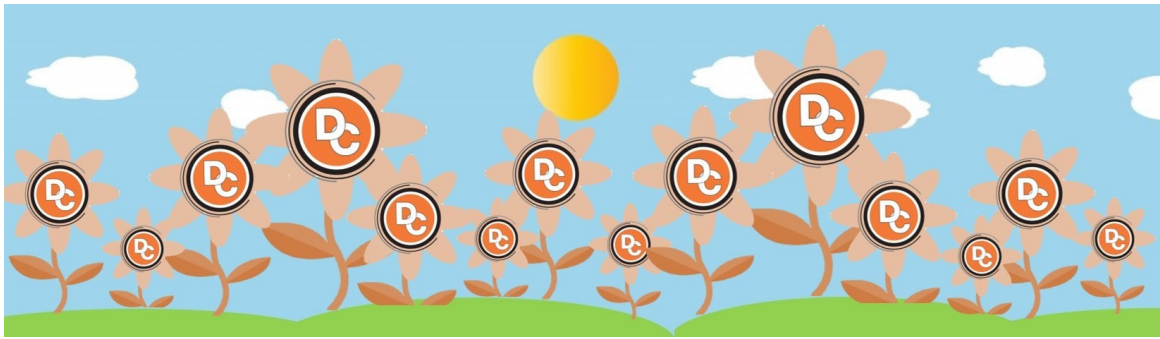
