IEP Exemptions from Competency

- Students must sit for the ELA and Math test at least **twice** to be considered for an exemption per Ohio law
- This applies to students taking End Of Course Exams (OSTs) and the AASCD
- EXCEPTION: Out of state move in seniors need to sit once
- If a student is exempted, they meet competency
 - Reminder: students can only be exempted in areas of need identified in the ETR and in which they are receiving remediation

College Credit Plus

Earn credit for one college-level math and/or college-level English course through Ohio's free College Credit Plus program.

What is College Credit Plus?

- Olentangy Local Schools participates in the College Credit Plus Program (CCP) where college-ready students in grades 7-12 can earn high school and college credit at the same time.

Military Enlistment

- Show evidence that you have signed a contract to enter a branch of the U.S. armed services upon graduation.



ACT or SAT Remediation Free Score

Obtain a remediation-free score in the math or English subject areas on the ACT or SAT. To demonstrate competency in English II, a student must be remediation-free in **BOTH** English and reading on the ACT.

Competency Alternative: Career Readiness

Complete 2 demonstrations to show competency, at least 1 must be a foundational option

Foundational Demonstration

- Cumulative score of proficient or higher on 3 or more WebXams in single career pathway
- Earn a 12-pt. approved industry-recognized credential or group of credentials totaling 12 pt. in one career field
- Earn a State issued license in a vocation that requires an examination
- Pre-apprenticeship or apprenticeship program
 - Registered with Ohio State Apprenticeship Council



Supporting Demonstration

- Complete 250-hours Work-based Learning
- Earn workforce readiness score on WorkKeys
- Earn the OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal

Foundational Demonstration

- **WebXams**- Students will take these if they are enrolled in a CTE Program at DACC (all programs except for Project Search, Food Service, Hospitality, Pharmacy AM/PM, CBI 9/10).

State Defined Seals



Technology Seal



Earn a score that is at least equivalent to proficient (2 or better) on an appropriate AP exam (Computer Science A or Computer Science Principles)



Biliteracy Seal



Meet the requirements and criteria, including proficiency on assessments in a world language and English. We offer the Avant STAMP 4s or Avant STAMP WS testing twice each year (fall and spring) and AP tests (late spring).



Military Enlistment



Provide evidence that a student has enlisted in a branch of the U.S. Armed Forces **OR** participate in an approved JROTC program for at least two years.



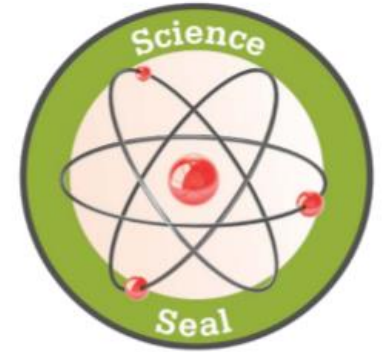
Industry Recognized Seal



Earn a 12-point approved industry-recognized credential or group of credentials totaling 12 points in a single career field.



Science Seal



1. Earn a score of proficient or higher on Biology OST;

OR

2. Earn a score that is at least equivalent to proficient (2 or better) on an appropriate AP (Biology, Chemistry, Physics 1, Physics 2, Physics C: E&M, Physics C: Mechanics) or IB exam;

OR

3. Earn a "B" or higher in any three-credit hour science course taken through College Credit Plus.

OR

4. Earn a "B" or higher in an advanced science course (grades in biology and honors biology do not meet this criteria)

* Students with an IEP earning a score of TBD on the Science AA for students with the Most Significant Cognitive Disabilities



Honors Diploma



Earn ***one*** of six Honors Diplomas:

- Academic Honor Diploma
- International Baccalaureate Honors Diploma
- Career-Tech Honors Diploma
- STEM Honors Diploma
- Arts Honors Diploma
- Social Science and Civic Engagement Diploma

State Defined Seal: Citizenship

Options to earn seal:

American History

- Earn a score of proficient “3” on Ohio’s State Test in American History
- Earn a final course grade equivalent to a “B” or higher in American history
- Earn a score equivalent to proficient “2” on Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate tests US History
- Earn a “B” or higher in American History College Credit Plus courses.

American Government

- Earn a score of proficient “3” on Ohio’s State Test in American Government
- Earn a final course grade equivalent to a “B” or higher in American Government
- Earn a score equivalent to proficient “2” on Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate tests US Government
- Earn a “B” or higher in American Government College Credit Plus course

- Students with an IEP earning a score TBD on the Social Studies Alternate Assessment for Students with the Most Significant Cognitive Disabilities



Ohio Means Jobs Readiness



- Demonstrate proficiency in each of the 15 identified professional skills (E.g. Drug free, reliability, leadership, critical thinking, teamwork, creativity, etc.)
- Student is required to document how he or she demonstrates each skill in one of three possible environments: school, work or community. *At least two environments must be reflected.*
- Have each skill validated by at least one mentor. *(A minimum of three mentors must be involved in the validation process.)*

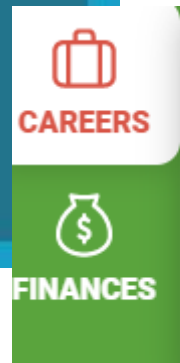


OMJ Resources- OLSD Work Sites

- OLSD offers high school students with disabilities school-based and community work-site experiences. These opportunities allow students to gain employability skills in an authentic environment. At work sites, students will be instructed by a job coach to improve their overall independence for employment. Job Coaches, Transition Coordinators, and community work-site managers, can be mentors for students in completion of their OMJ Readiness Seal Validation Form.

College Ready Seal



The College Ready Seal is earned for achieving remediation free scores on the ACT or SAT.

- **ACT**-Minimum scores of 22 in Reading and Math & score of 18 in English.
 - **SAT**-Minimum scores of 480 on Evidence-Based Reading and Writing (EBRW), and 530 on Mathematics.
- ❖ Scores change from year to year



Local Seals



Fine and Performing Arts

Demonstrate skills in the fine or performing arts according to an evaluation aligned with guidelines adopted by the student's local board of education or school governing authority.

During his/her high school career (9th grade and after), a student can:

- Earn at least two credits in fine arts courses

OR

- Participate in two or more fine/performing arts programs/performances inside/outside of school (verification form completed by the student and signed by the teacher director from the outside organization)



Student Engagement Seal

Participate in extracurricular activities such as athletics, clubs or student government to a meaningful extent, as determined by guidelines adopted by the student's local board of education or school governing authority.

During his/her high school career (9th grade and after), a student can:

- Participate in at least one year of two or two years of one of the following activities (*Note: Students earning the PE waiver will automatically earn this seal.*)
 - Athletics*
 - JROTC
 - Marching Band
 - Show Choir
 - Theater*
 - School-sponsored/board approved club
- Students will need club advisor/director to verify satisfactory participation

*If a student is using non-school sponsored athletics or theater, they will need to complete a verification form signed by the coach/director.



Community Service Seal

Complete a community service project aligned with the guidelines by the student's local board of education or school governing authority.

During his/her high school career (9th grade and after), a student can:

- Complete 120 community service hours over 4 years

OR

- Complete 40 community service hours during senior year
 - *Pro-rated to 20 hours for seniors who move in January of their senior year*
- At least 50% of a student's hours need to be in one concentrated field
- Student will complete a form that logs hours, describes service and has verification signature(s)

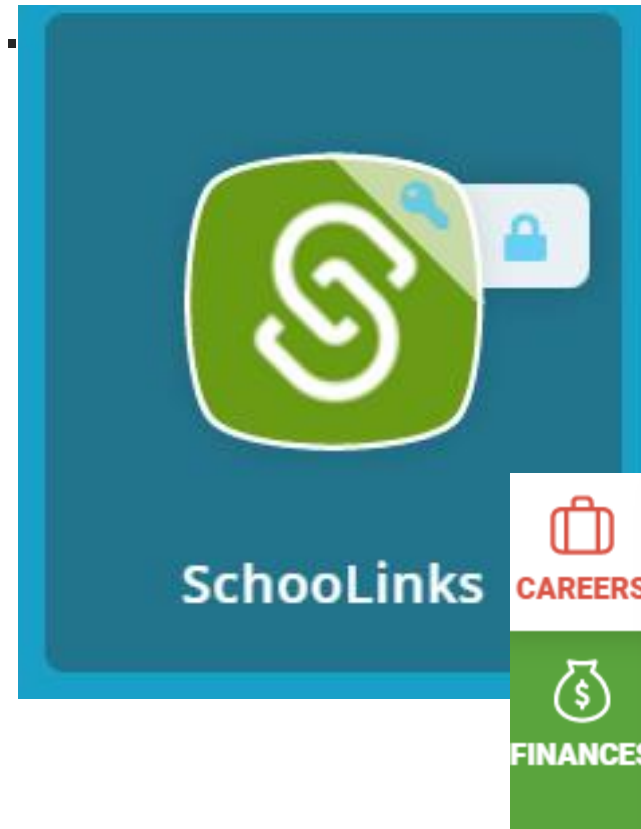
