TRACK TEAMS HEAD TO ANNUAL DIVINE CHILD INVITE

The sun finally arrived just in time for the Notre Dame Boys and Girls Track and Field teams for last Saturday's 11th Annual Mark Carpenter Invite at Divine Child High School. Senior Jack Olis continued his PR trend, this time in both the 110m and 300m hurdles. Olis crossed the line in 19.76 in the 110m distance, then 43.32 in the 300m distance, good for fifth. Sophomore Zach Mylenek tied for ninth in the 400m dash in 53.14 and was third overall in the 200m dash while setting a new PR of 23.34. In the 1600m run, Tyler Wojichowski logged a 5:13.46, freshman Isaak Brook was right behind in 5:13.70, and freshman Ryan Wojichowski crossed the line in 5:28.96. Brook and R. Wojichowski followed that performance with PRs in the 800m run, 2:19.08 and 2:25.22, respectively. Senior Jack Kautz had a massive PR in the 400m dash, 57.41. In relays, the team of sophomore Brandon Burbank, senior Frank Roth, senior Chris Galle, and sophomore Lucas Mylenek recorded a season best time of 47.31, while Zach Mylenek, Tyler Wojichowski, Olis, and Galle had a season best time in the 4x400m, 3:40, to place fourth. On the girls side, sophomore Zoe Hoke placed fourth overall in the 1600m run at 5:43.77, then was 10th in the 800m run in 2:40.99. Senior Kate Stacey notched a PR in the 400m dash to place eighth in 1:03.20. Freshmen Skylar Vanhecke and Violet Dedivanaj had PRs in the 200m dash. Vanhecke's time was 33.76 and Dedivanaj's time was 34.87.

PITCHING, DEFENSE LEAD IRISH OVER ADAMS

The Notre Dame Varsity Baseball team utilized strong pitching and defense to best Rochester Adams 2-1 in a low scoring affair. Luke Babich went all seven innings on the mound, allowing only two hits and an earned run to earn the victory. As a team, the Irish finished with five hits. Notre Dame scored both its runs in the fourth inning with Jacob Samuels picking up an RBI.

GIRLS LACROSSE TAKES FINAL HOME GAME

The Notre Dame Girls Varsity Lacrosse team earned a 10-9 win over Brighton in the final home, regular season game of the year. Maria Caton finished with three goals and three assists while Abby Stowe had a goal and three assists. Jane Bubka and Sydney Schulte had two goals each and both Katie Buccini and Elise Glotkowski added a goal a piece. Maria Mervenne was strong in net all evening for Notre Dame, including two key saves in the final minute to preserve the victory for the Irish.

SECOND HALF OFFENSE LEADS IRISH OVER WOODHAVEN



Ethan Janssen added a hit and the lone Irish RBI. In the second game, Jeremy Gale and two hits including a triple and three RBI while Janssen and Ben Sermo each added two hits.

IRISH SWEEP DH FROM MUSTANGS

The Notre Dame Varsity Softball team swept a doubleheader over Marian, 16-1 and 15-5. Annie Wachowiak picked up both wins while Stephanie Dzialo and Jordan Smith came on in relief. Smith finished the day with a home run and two RBI at the plate while Morgan Bissett had four hits, scored four times and drove in five. Wachowiak had seven hits, including four doubles and a home run, scored five times and drove in four. Dzialo added five hits, four runs and five RBI between the two wins.

5/6 BASEBALL CONTINUES UNBEATEN SEASON

The Notre Dame 5/6 Baseball team improved to 6-0 with a 11-7 victory over Oakland Christian. Ross Cherfoli started the game for the Irish and pitched three innings, giving up six runs and recording five strikeouts. Evan Blanchard pitched the final four innings in relief, giving up only one run and striking out seven batters. Blanchard added two hits, including a home run, and scored three runs. Cherfoli also had two hits and scored twice. Camden Gendreau, Preston Schlachter, and Dane Studt all recorded a hit apiece. William Platt had a number of fine plays at second base and made several putouts, in a very well-played, competitive game.

TRACK TAKES ON LUTHERAN NORTH, GABRIEL RICHARD

In the first dual meet of the season, the Notre Dame Boys and Girls Track and Field teams competed against Lutheran High North and Riverview Gabriel Richard. Sophomore Zach Mylenek led the way for the boys team, racing his first ever 100m dash and making his high school debut

in the 800m run. Mylenek took top placing in both events with times of 11.40 and 2:11.70. Senior Jack Olis won the 300m hurdles in 43.96 and placed third in the 100m dash in 11.93. Senior Anthony Zaleski was fourth in the 110m hurdles in 21.25, a new PR. In the 400m dash, sophomore Lucas Mylenek competed in the event for the first time and placed second in 57.14, followed by senior Jack Kautz in 59.11. Racing in the 1600m run, freshman Isaak Brook was third in 5:16.90, while senior Tyler Wojichowski placed fourth in 5:18.00. In relays, Zach Mylenek, senior Josh Reid, Olis, and senior Chris Galle crossed the line first in 3:45.8. In field events, three throwers PR'd in the shot put; Kautz tossed the shot 37'4", freshman Jake Gartin, 34'9.5", and senior Peter Channo, 31'4.5". Reid notched a win in the long jump with a jump of 18'3.5", a personal best. On the girls side, senior Kate Stacey had two wins of her own. First, Stacey won the 400m dash in 1:03.75, then did it again in the 200m dash in 29.11. Sophomore Zoe Hoke and freshman Maria Nunning went 1-2 in the 800m run with Hoke recording a 2:40.80 and Nunning 2:46.30, which is a PR. Nunning also set a new PR in the 1600m run, 6:04.60, to place second. Sophomore Alaina Byrne had a pair of third place finishes in hurdle events, setting a personal best in the 100m hurdles in 19.97. Other PRs on the day were recorded by Galle (100m), sophomore Luke Burtraw (100m), freshman Chis Estrellas (200m), sophomore Becker Robinson (200m), senior Ally Heaman (100m hurdles), and freshman Skylar Vanhecke (200m).
