Forecast Approved With Thanks

The Canton Local School District truly appreciates the community's support of the renewal levy in May. The Canton Local Board of Education recently approved the five-year financial forecast presented by Treasurer **Jason Schatzel**. As required by law, all school districts across Ohio must create a financial five-year forecast in November of every year and an updated forecast in May which includes three years of actual and five years of projected general fund revenues and expenditures. Not only is it an important financial planning tool, but it also offers community members an open and honest review of school district finances and operations. Although state law does not require boards of education to set aside time for public comment, the Board recognizes the value of public input on educational issues and has adopted Bylaw 0169.01 to provide for public comments.

Hunger: The Bus Stopped Here

The Canton Local School district was pleased to participate in the county-wide initiative "Hunger: The Bus Stops Here" food drive campaign benefiting the Akron-Canton Regional Food Bank. Of the 16 schools participating in the drive, Canton Local collected the most amount of food with 3,611 pounds. The district also collected the second-most in monetary donations with \$707, trailing only Sandy Valley, which collected \$758.

For every \$1 donation received, the Akron-Canton Regional Foodbank can provide four nutritious meals to individuals in our community through their partnership with area hunger centers and programs.

The district greatly appreciates the generosity of students, staff and community members. Canton Local is always one of the top donating school districts in the county.

Wildcat Preschool Available

The Wildcat Preschool program serves children who live in the Canton Local District. All three and four-year-old children with and without developmental delays are eligible, with enrollment priority given to four-year-old children and those with identified disabilities. Tuition is based on income eligibility and is often at no cost to parents.

Wildcat Preschool is rated 5-Stars by the Ohio Department of Education and the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services. This is the highest rating a preschool can receive.

The preschool program includes free breakfast, lunch, and transportation to and from Walker Elementary School. Class sizes are limited. Call 330-484-8022 for more information on qualification and registration.

Vaccination Requirements

Prior to the start of school, students entering seventh grade are required to have Tdap and Meningitis vaccines and students entering 12th grade are required to have an updated Meningitis vaccine. If your child has received the required vaccinations, and you have not submitted the vaccine record, please submit a copy of their updated immunization record to your child's building. If your child has not received the required vaccines, please call your physician or another provider to obtain the vaccines.

District Mourns Dr. Walker

Canton Local Schools mourns the passing of former superintendent **Dr. Harold R. Walker** on February 24, 2021. Dr. Walker began his professional career in 1953 as a teacher and guidance counselor at Canton South High School. He served as Principal of Amos McDannel Elementary School in Canton Local and both Harter and Worley Schools in Canton City. Dr. Walker's public-school service also included being Superintendent of Canton Local Schools, Louisville City Schools and the Canton City School District. He chose to spend part of his career in higher education and served Malone College as a Professor in Education and Behavioral Sciences, Chairman of The Division of Education and Psychology, and as Executive Vice President of the College. He was also a part-time staff member of the Ohio School Boards Association as Regional Secretary for Northeast Ohio for many years. Dr. Walker received many recognitions and professional awards. The first Junior High School in Canton Local School District was named in his honor in 1962, and he was inducted into the inaugural class of the Canton Local Hall of Distinction in 2020.


