Although state law does not require boards of education to set aside time for public comment, the Board recognizes the value of public input on educational issues and has adopted Bylaw 0169.01, effective 7/18/11, to provide for public comments.

Kindergarten Registration Set

Children who will be 5 years of age on or before September 30, 2021, are able to attend kindergarten in the Canton Local School District for the 2021-2022 school year. Families are asked to complete a brief survey at cantonlocal.org and sign up to receive details about online kindergarten registration the week of April 12-16. Those registering during the event will be eligible for gifts and prizes!



Documents needed

Parents registering their children for kindergarten must have the following documentation:

- Child's Social Security card
- Child's Birth certificate
- One current proof of residency, for example: phone bill, electric bill, rental agreement, home purchase agreement, etc
- Immunization records
- Driver's license
- Custody or court documentation verifying custodial parent (divorce or disillusionment), and foster or grandparent placement papers (if applicable)
- Names and phone numbers of family physicians, preferred hospitals and dentist would be helpful

Preschool Preregistration Open

Preregistration for 2021-2022 school year is now open for the Wildcat Preschool Program offered by Canton Local Schools and the Stark County ESC at Walker Elementary. Availability is limited and based on a first come first serve so call ASAP to reserve your child's spot.

Morning and afternoon preschool classes are offered for three and four- year-old children who are typically developing, those that qualify financially, and those with developmental delays. Transportation is offered for 4-year-olds and those who qualify under special circumstances.

Wildcat Preschool provides an opportunity, through active and quiet play for children to grow through a variety of experiences. It is our belief that every child can learn and that the preschool experience should be positive, enjoyable, and rewarding for children and their families. Activities provided in our preschool are multi-cultural, play based, and child initiated. As the nurturing occurs in the preschool environment, the child develops communication skills and learns to interact with others in his/her world. We recognize that parents are the primary teachers of their children and strive to form a partnership with parents to enrich the learning experience.

Each of our teachers are Ohio Department of Education certified with four-year Early Childhood Education degrees and the program has been rated as a 5 Star "Step Up to Quality" program. This is the highest rating a preschool can receive.



- All of these games help students work on math skills that build upon the skills learned at school daily.







Dennison comes from New Philadelphia Schools where







CANTONLOCAL SCHOOLS RENEWAL LEVY A NEW TAX

Facts about the May 4, 2021 Renewal Levy Issue #11

- Not a New Tax
- Renewal request is for 8.9 mills operating and 1.9 mills permanent improvement generating \$3.9 million per year.
- The need for the renewal has nothing to do with the new buildings! The renewal is needed regardless of construction.
- Operating dollars are used by the district to pay staff to educate, feed, counsel, support, and transport students.
- Permanent improvement levy funds are used to help pay for buses, technology, maintenance equipment and building improvements.

What will the renewal levy cost taxpayers?

The renewal levy is NOT a New Tax and will not increase taxes.

What is a renewal levy?

Ohio law allows districts to ask voters to renew a limited levy when it expires. The levy must be for the same purpose and is renewed at the current millage rate. Canton Local's renewal request is for 8.9 mils for operations and 1.9 for permanent improvements for a 5-year term. The expiring levies were last renewed in 2016.

What is included in operating dollars?

Operating levy funds are used by the district to pay staff to educate, feed, counsel, support and transport students as well as implement improvements in safety and security, mental health, academics programming, arts and extra-curriculars.

What is included in permanent improvement dollars?

Permanent improvement levy funds are used to help pay for buses, technology, maintenance equipment and building improvements.

Does the district have a levy on the ballot because of the new middle school?

The renewal is needed regardless of the new construction project. The new middle school is being funded in partnership with the Ohio Schools Facilities Commission along with public utility taxes that the district set aside over the past several years.

What is the district doing to reduce costs and operate efficiently?

The district:

- Maintains staffing levels to meet student needs and enrollment projections
- Utilizes business and community partnerships to fund special projects
- Applies for state and federal grant opportunities
- Monitors interest rates and refinances bonds, saving taxpayers nearly \$3 million since 2014

Canton Local Schools Saving Taxpayers Money

Canton Local residents with a home valued at \$100k paid \$235 more per year in taxes in 2014 than a person in 2019 with a home valued at \$100k.

There are a couple of reasons for the reduced property tax burden on Canton Local taxpayers:

- Public utility company valuations have continued to rise taking some of the burden off residential taxpayers.
- The District has refinanced the bonded debt issued for the new high school 3 times, resulting in a reduced overall debt cost with each refinancing. The cumulative amount of savings from refinancing debt is over \$3 million. This is a direct savings to taxpayers.
