Canton Local to Induct Inaugural Hall of Distinction Class

Canton Local Schools will honor a select group of individuals who have had a profound effect on the district and community by inducting them into the Hall of Distinction. The inductees will be celebrated at the Hall of Distinction Recognition Dinner at Skyland Pines on April 23, 2020.

"Inclusion in the Hall of Distinction reflects the respect and admiration held by the Canton Local School District for these individuals, both living and deceased," said Superintendent Steve Milano. "These inductees have positively shaped our schools and the community to which we are inextricably linked. They serve as an inspiration to both our current and future students."

The 2019 Hall of Distinction inductees are:



Charles "Red" Ash: Canton South High School teacher and coached football, basketball and baseball. During his 37-year tenure he was one of Stark County's winningest coaches and was inducted into the Ohio Basketball Hall of Fame. After retiring from education, he was elected and served in the Ohio General Assembly.



First Lieutenant Sharon Lane, RN: Canton South graduate 1961. Graduated from the Aultman Hospital School of Nursing before joining the U.S. Army Nurse Corps Reserve. Only American nurse killed as a direct result of hostile fire in Vietnam.



Louis "Lou" Mikunda: Canton South graduate 1943. Beloved CSHS Booster Club member, basketball score keeper, football equipment manager, baseball field groundskeeper, team bus driver and Kiwanis summer baseball team coach.

Dr. H. R. Walker: Began his teaching career in 1953 at Canton South High School. After two years, he was appointed principal of Amos McDannel Elementary School. At the age of 30, Dr. Walker was named Superintendent. Through his insight, determination and untiring efforts, he brought community-centered and child-centered education to the district.

Inductees in the Hall of Distinction must demonstrate an outstanding record of achievement spanning his or her professional career, distinguished service to the community, sustained activities that show an exceptionally strong commitment to the Canton Local community and the highest integrity. Honorees do not need to be alumni of Canton South High School. *See page 18-19 for details and an invitation to the event.*

All action of the Board takes place in public session. However, the Board may adjourn to an executive session, in accordance with Ohio's open meeting law, to discuss personnel matters, land purchases, negotiations, pending court action, security arrangements and confidential records. Any action resulting from the discussion in the executive session must be made during a public session of the Board. Although state law does not require boards of education to set aside time for public comment, the Board recognizes the value of public input on educational issues and has adopted Bylaw 0169.01, effective 7/18/11, to provide for public comments.

Community Update Meeting

The administration, along with the architect/engineer, GPD Group, will present to the community an update on the current design status of the new Canton South Middle School. This project is in partnership with the state's Ohio Facility Construction Commission and will be located just south of the high school on the same property, creating a middle-high campus. The new facility will be complete for the start of the 2022-23 school year. Information will also be presented on proposed improvements to Faircrest Memorial Middle School.

New Press Box at Brechbuhler Stadium



The final piece of the Brechbuhler Stadium upgrade is underway! The facility is being outfitted with a new press box on the home side of the bleachers. The old press box was torn down and a new updated one is currently being constructed. The design and color scheme will match the concession stand and locker room that was built in 2019. The new structure will feature increased square footage to allow for better usage by our coaches, game workers and media. The project is scheduled to be completed in the middle of March 2020. Stanley Miller Construction, a company located in Canton, is doing the work.

It is our belief that every child can learn and that the preschool experience should be positive, enjoyable, and rewarding for children and their families. Activities provided in our preschool are multi-cultural, play based, and child initiated. As the nurturing occurs in the preschool environment, the child develops communication skills and learns to interact with others in his/her world. We recognize that parents are the primary teachers of their children, and strive to form a partnership with parents in order to enrich the learning experience.

D.A.R.E. Fourth-Grade Graduation

All Walker fourth-graders participated in the Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) program during the second quarter of the school year. The program is evidenced-based and teaches students how to control their impulses and think about risks and consequences. This follows the teachings of Socio-Emotional Learning Theories, SEL, which are now Ohio Learning Standards. The focus for D.A.R.E. is to teach self-awareness and management, responsible decision-making, understanding others, relationship and communication skills, and handling responsibilities and challenges.

Deputy Antenora provided instruction to fourth-graders. He has been in law enforcement for the past 14 years and has worked as a Stark County Sheriff for the past five years. Last summer, Deputy Antenora completed D.A.R.E. Instructor School and is a certified to teach D.A.R.E. for K-12.


FMMS VETERANS PROGRAM

Faircrest Memorial Middle School was named in honor of the nine Canton Local alumni who lost their lives during the Vietnam War: Sharon Lane (the first woman who died under enemy fire in Vietnam), Larry Rogers, Billy Greavu, Fred Penland, David Brooks (the last and only Stark County resident who died in Vietnam in 1972), Leonard Schoeppner (MIA), William Masters, Benjamin Stoffer II and Frank Sills.

During the 1990-91 school year, students in Valerie Kinney and Barb Weaver's intensive needs class made and sold patriotic buttons to buy supplies for the troops in Desert Storm. Their efforts brought in \$1,100.00, however, the war ended before the donation could be made. It was decided that the money would be used to host a Veterans Day celebration.

As part of the first Veterans program, The Freedom Shrine, (donated by the Canton Exchange Club), which hangs in the main entryway of Faircrest, was presented and dedicated. The Freedom Shrine is an impressive display of a collection of historical document replicas that serves to remind all of us of the great efforts that have been taken to ensure our freedom.

Faircrest continues the tradition with a Veterans Day community program every November. This year's event was organized by Social Studies Teacher Ben Palumbo.




