SPECIAL STUDENT SERVICES AVAILABLE

The CLSD Special Services Department represents a variety of student support programs and services focused on success for all students. Helping students make a good adjustment to school life, bringing families and schools together, and supporting students with individual needs is the focus of each of the special service programs.

Special Services programs operate in each of the schools within the school district. Special Education Services provide programming to students ranging from age 3 through 21 who have an identified disability. Special Education staff members include intervention specialists tutors, paraprofessionals, counselors, nurses, therapists and psychologists.

Preschool Now Open for 3-5 Year-Olds

Canton Local Schools 5-star preschool education for those students who meet the eligibility. Walker Elementary has three preschool classrooms and each class has different criteria for admission. Canton Local's preschool program has received a Five-Star Step Up to Quality Award from the Ohio Department of Education (ODE).

Ohio's Tiered Quality Rating & Improvement System

The first preschool program is a partnership between Canton Local Schools and the Stark County Educational Service Center. This program is called Stark County Integrated Preschool (SCIP). The preschool is offered 4 half days per week to children 3-5 years of age who have been identified as developmentally

delayed in one or more of the following areas: communication, vision, hearing, motor skills, social-emotional/behavioral functioning, self-help skills, and/or cognitive skills. This program also accepts children who are typically developing to serve as role models in the class.

The second preschool program is funded by a grant through the Ohio Department of Education. The children enrolled in this program need to meet income eligibility requirements and be typically developing. This classroom is also offered 4 half days per week for children who are 3-5 years of age. The entire family has opportunities for involvement in their children's preschool education, which begins the journey for the home-school partnership. Children between the ages of 3 and 5 are eligible, as long as they are not 5 years old before August 1st of the current school year.

SMITH RECOGNIZED FOR LIFE SAVING EFFORTS

The American Red Cross presented Canton South Sports Medicine teacher Kristen Smith with its Certificate of Merit for her efforts that helped save a fellow teacher's life. It is the highest award given by the Red Cross to an individual or team of individuals who saves or sustains a life by using skills and knowledge learned in a Red Cross Training Services course.

Last January, Kristen—who is trained in Red Cross First Aid/CPR/AED—recognized the signs when a colleague began to choke during lunch. She quickly reacted, confirmed that the teacher was indeed choking, and performed abdominal thrusts until food was dislodged from her colleague's airway.

Kristen's colleagues nominated her for the Certificate of Merit over summer break, worked with Red Cross representatives to verify her remarkable actions, and helped plan for the award's presentation.

Jeff Moore, principal of Canton South High School, said, "Kristen exemplifies what we want all of our staff and students to be, someone who takes their education/training and uses those for the betterment of others, someone who is caring and is not afraid to be involved. We could not be more proud of Kristen and all she represents in Wildcat Nation."



Canton Local Hall of Distinction Class of 2020



NEW FAMILY SUPPORT SPECIALIST TO PROVIDE SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL ASSISTANCE








VETERANS DAY CELEBRATION


GET ON BAND BOOSTER'S BUS
