The Miami County Educational Service Center currently provides preschool services for Covington students who qualify as a child with a disability. This pre-school is for children who are three and four years old. Students may be enrolled any time throughout the school year. There is a screening process that children must go through at the Miami County Pre-school offices in Troy.

The county pre-school may have 10 to 12 students. Eight of these students are students who qualify for early intervention prior to kindergarten. The rest are typical students. Upcoming Summer Projects

As we do each summer, we will take advantage of our time without students to provide a few upgrades to the school building and the surrounding facilities. First, the gym floor in the high school building will be sanded down and resurfaced. This minor repair will extend the life of this gym floor by approximately ten to fifteen years, and provide a much better surface for our Physical Education classes and our athletic contests.

In addition, we will upgrade the restrooms at Smith Field. This project will be a cosmetic upgrade and will not involve changing the structure. When the fall arrives, you will notice new partitions, new doors, a resurfaced floor, and an overall new and clean appearance. This upgrade is long overdue and is greatly needed to help maintain our excellent facilities.

Finally, minor repairs will be made to the parking lots around the school. Each of the small cracks that have developed in the lots will be filled. In addition, the CHS lot and the lot in front of the Board office will receive new top-coats. We will continue to make minor repairs to these parking lots and drive ways each year. This routine maintenance will allow us to extend the life of each of these areas for years to come.
