

What's on the ballot?

QUESTION #1:

Renew the Capital Project Levy for Technology Increase levy by \$500,000 to \$3.5 million/annually for 10 years. Funds all student/staff/district technology equipment,

infrastructure and personnel.

QUESTION #2: Building Bond Referendum




