 PROCLAMATION FROM NEW JERSEY SCHOOL BOARDS ASSOCIATION: WHEREAS, The New Jersey School Boards Association has declared January 2016 to be School Board Recognition Month, a time that all residents might acknowledge the contributions made by our local school board members; and

WHEREAS, The Lyndhurst Board of Education is one of 586 local school boards in New Jersey that sets policies and oversees operations for public school districts; and

WHEREAS, The Lyndhurst Board of Education embraces the goal of high-quality education for all New Jersey public school students; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey's local school boards help determine community goals for the education of approximately 1.4 million children in pre-kindergarten through 12th grade; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey's 4,800 local school board members, who receive no remuneration for their services, act as advocates for public school students as they work with administrators, teachers and parents for the betterment of public education; and

WHEREAS, School boards strive to provide the resources necessary to meet the needs of all students, including those with special needs; and

WHEREAS, Boards of education provide accountability to the public; they communicate the needs of the school district to the public; and they convey to school administrators the public's expectations for the schools; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey can take pride in its schools, which rank among the nation's best in indicators such as high school graduation rates, class size, college entrance exam participation and Advanced Placement offerings and test scores. Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Lyndhurst Board of Education urges all New Jersey citizens to work with their local boards of education and public school staffs toward the improvement of our children's education.

Beginning with the September 2011-2012 school year, our school district has conscientiously implemented the requirements found in the *Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act* by thoroughly examining and practicing the law's timelines and mandated initiatives, maintaining ongoing dialogue between administration and anti-bullying specialists, and providing and allowing for ongoing professional development for all key stakeholders.

Since the implementation of the *Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act*, our school district has made progress in addressing and improving harassment, intimidation and bullying as well as the school climate and culture by using a consistent language across district to discuss both challenges and successes, while also developing district-wide initiatives to educate the community.

While completing the Self-Assessment, we learned that our school district has demonstrated strengths in these areas:

- · Identifying HIB personnel
- Adhering to the HIB investigative procedure
- Implementing curriculum and instruction on HIB and related information and skills

The Self-Assessment helped our school district to identify that the following areas can be approved on:

- Implementing HIB programs, approaches and other initiatives
- Providing training on the BOE-Approved HIB Policy

Our school district plans to further assess strengths and vulnerabilities for learning by conducting a school climate survey. We plan to closely examine the possibility of conducting the Rutgers Climate and Culture survey throughout our district. Our School Safety Teams have discussed it, and the Anti-Bullying Coordinators will be discussing more specifics with Central Office administration.

In order to promote a positive school climate, our school district is teaching students social-emotional learning skills by utilizing grade-level appropriate resources to introduce topics and learning goals. Anti-Bullying Specialists remain in communication with health teachers as well as all core-content area teachers collaborating regularly about how to implement these crucial skills into our classrooms.

During the upcoming year, our school district will be working towards and seeking your involvement in improving district-wide communication and practices by having more unification meetings among administration, antibullying coordinators and specialists, and planning district-wide events.

Our district 2014-2015 HIB Grade was <u>66 out of 78</u>. This is a <u>7-point</u> increase from our 2013-2014 HIB Grade.
