The Town Meeting of the Town of Suffield was called to order by Town Clerk Kathy Dunai, at 7:01 PM. The Town Meeting was held at the Suffield Middle School, 350 Mountain Road, Suffield, CT.

Upon nomination by Lisa Trase, 617 Halladay Avenue, with a second by Michele Urch, 312 North Grand Street, Edward McAnaney, 85 Wren Drive, was unanimously elected moderator by voice vote.

There were no additional nominations for moderator from the floor.

The Pledge of Allegiance was orchestrated by Moderator McAnaney.

Town Clerk Kathy Dunai read the Legal Notice into record as published in *the Journal Inquirer* on May 5, 2022.

A motion was made by Derek Donnelly, 988 Russell Avenue to suspend Roberts Rules and allow for discussion on all motions simultaneously and that all motions be accepted by voice vote and that all votes conducted tonight be made by voice vote. This motion was seconded by Kathleen Harington, 700 North Street.

The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Charles Flynn, 21 Harmon Drive, with a second by Anne Borg, 1310 Mountain Road, presented the following resolution for discussion.

#1. Resolved: That the Town Meeting of the Town of Suffield authorizes and approves the proposed budget with a total expenditure of \$62,880,936.

Carol Thibedeau, 50 Chestnut Circle, with a second by Donald Miner, 1855 Mapleton Avenue, presented the following resolution for discussion.

#2. Resolved: That the Town Meeting of the Town of Suffield authorizes the use and expenditure of American Recovery Plan Act funds as recommended by the Board of Selectmen and Board of Finance.

Tom Frenyae, 489 Warnertown Road, with a second by Chris Childs, 338 South Main Street, presented the following to amend the motion for clarification

#2A Motion to Clarify American Recovery Plan Act should be documented as the American Rescue Plan Act.

The motion clarification passed unanimously by voice vote.

Lisa Anderson, 128 Halladay Avenue East, with a second by Melissa Finnigan, 50Cedar Crest Lane, presented the following resolution for discussion.

#3. **Resolved:** That the Town Meeting of the Town of Suffield authorizes the additional authorization outside of the Town budget of \$485,625 in expenditures for the Quarry Road bridge replacement to be offset by a grant of \$485,625.

Ryan Anderson, 128 Halladay Avenue East, with a second by Michele Urch, 312 North Grand Street, presented the following resolution for discussion.

First Selectman Colin Moll was invited to the podium to present the Selectman's Budget PowerPoint and address questions regarding the breakdown. Board of Finance Chairman also assisted with questions from the attendees.

Superintendent of the Suffield Public School Timothy Van Tasel, ED.D with the assistance of Maureen Sattan Chairman of the Board of Education presented the Board of Education Budget PowerPoint and addressed questions from the attendants.

Moderator McAnaney asked if there was no more questions from the attendees he moved to a vote on the motions presented prior.

#1. Resolved: That the Town Meeting of the Town of Suffield authorizes and approves the proposed budget with a total expenditure of \$62,880,936.

The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

#2. Resolved: That the Town Meeting of the Town of Suffield authorizes the use and expenditure of American Rescue Plan Act funds as recommended by the Board of Selectmen and Board of Finance.

The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

#3. Resolved: That the Town Meeting of the Town of Suffield authorizes the additional authorization outside of the Town budget of \$485,625 in expenditures for the Quarry Road bridge replacement to be offset by a grant of \$485,625.

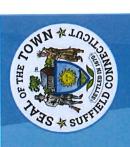

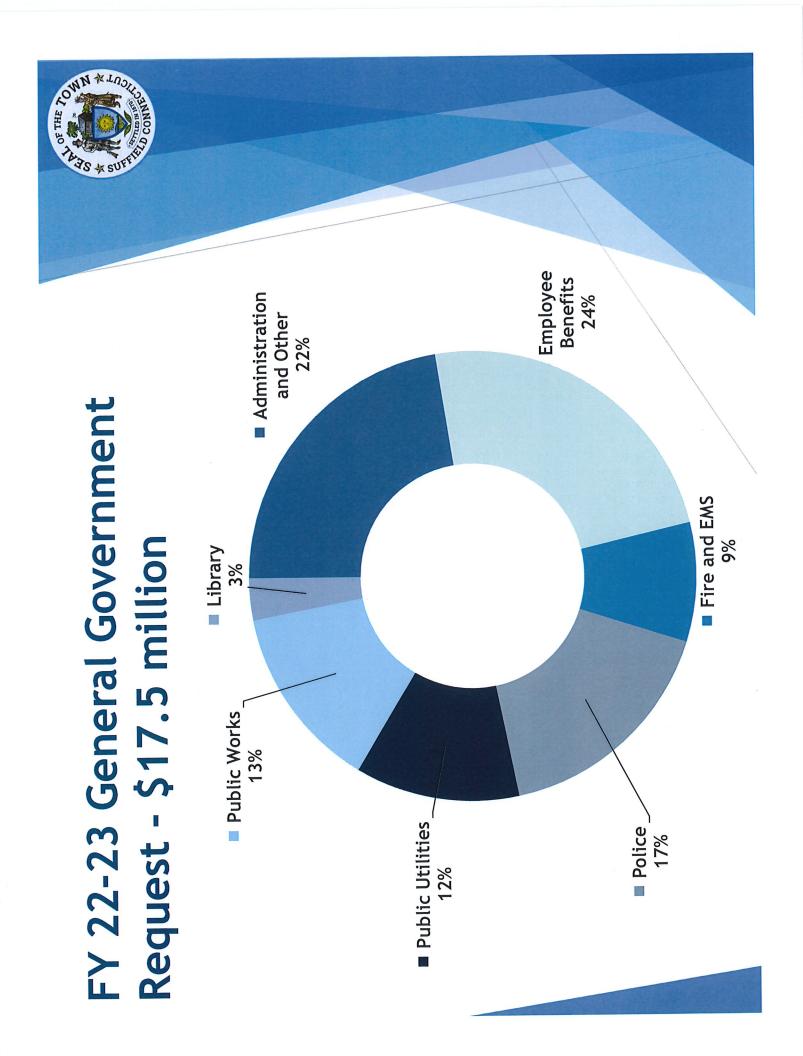

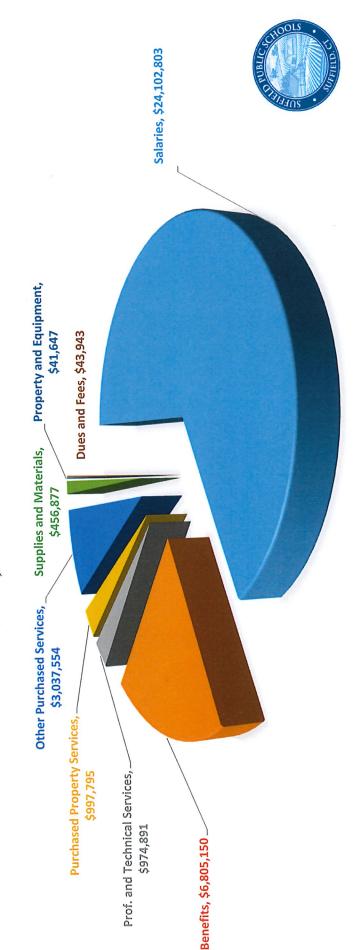

Personnel Changes

To address the high interest in CTE classes and provide high school students the opportunity to explore manufacturing and industrial trades. (offset from SMS Special Education Reduction) 1.0 FTE SHS Career and Technical Education Teacher

1.0 FTE AWS Elementary Classroom Teacher

To maintain consistent class sizes from students moving from First to Second Grade due to specialized needs of students.

0.5 FTE Instrumental Music Teacher

To provide Grade 4 students opportunity to participate in the instrumental music program.

Currently, instrumental music is for fifth grade only.

0.5 FTE Custodial Support

To meet building maintenance needs while students are in school.

Currently, there is only I custodian on staff at SHS during the school day.

0.5 FTE Financial Assistant

To prepare for future personnel turnover in the Business Department.

Succession planning is important to ensure a smooth Business Office transition in key positions (Payroll and Accounts Payables).

Proposed personnel changes will be adjusted to meet \$250,000 BOF reduction. This will occur during May BOE budget deliberations.
