Talk Sup Week 20 Review and Preview

January 31, 2022

Good morning Sayreville! I hope you had a relaxing weekend and were not too affected by Saturday's snowstorm. Welcome to another edition of Talk Sup. Speaking of Saturday's snowstorm, as I noted in my broadcast email yesterday, thanks to the hard work and dedication demonstrated by our amazing Buildings and Grounds staff, who worked tirelessly throughout the day yesterday and Saturday to clear snow, with the exception of the <u>high school</u>, which will be <u>closed</u> today due to a ruptured pipe, we will have a regular school opening today. However, while we will be out salting early this morning, due to the extremely frigid temperatures, please be careful navigating our parking lots and sidewalks, as there is still a layer of snow and ice on them that will remain until Tuesday when temperatures are expected to rise above freezing. Also, please remember that today and every day this week we will dismiss <u>students</u> early so that parents and our faculty can participate in Parent/Teacher Conferences.

Speaking of Parent Teacher Conferences, in our continuing effort to encourage and reinforce communication between parents/guardians and the schools, we have scheduled five days of <u>virtual</u> or <u>remote</u> parent/teacher conferences this week. During each day of conferences, we will dismiss students early from school so that our faculty members can be available to discuss the progress of students in individual classes. Thus, parents can schedule conferences with multiple teachers. See the complete schedule below.

This afternoon at 4 pm the district will officially open registration for our free Full-Day Project Before Preschool and Kindergarten Programs. Therefore, parents of ALL eligible (must be 3 for preschool and 5 for kindergarten by September 30, 2022) preschool and kindergarten students are invited to visit our website in order to register via Oncourse Connect, our online registration software. The link to student registration will be clearly identified on our district website homepage (www.sayrevillek12.net) as "<u>Student Registration</u>". Once on this registration page, you can obtain pertinent information regarding the registration of all students including preschool and kindergarten students, and you can begin completing the online registration application by clicking on one of the following links noted in the 2022-2023 Project Before and Kindergarten text box: <u>New Student Registration Preschool and Kindergarten</u> or <u>Returning Student Enrollment Update for students entering grades PreK and</u> Kindergarten during the 2022-2023 school year.

Over the weekend, it was reported to us that two individuals from the middle school, one from the Truman School, one from the Eisenhower School, one from the Project Before at Cheesequake School, and one from the Transportation Department have tested positive for COVID-19. After conducting contact tracing in accordance with New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH) guidelines, individuals from Truman were determined to be in "close contact" with the infected people. Educating Today's Learners to Be Tomorrow's Leaders

Please remember that, as I reported to you last Thursday, the following new guidelines will go into effect this <u>Tuesday, February 1st</u>: children <u>12 years of age and older</u> MUST have had a **booster shot** (if they received their 2nd shot of Pfizer or Moderna more than 6 months ago or their J&J shot more than two months ago) to be eligible for <u>exclusion from having to quarantine</u> when determined to be in close contact to and infected individual. Thus, below please find our revised chart for the specific guidelines for isolation and close contact quarantining.

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With the recent surge in COVID-19 cases, we continue to implore that parents:

- Do <u>not</u> send their child(ren) to school if they are symptomatic.
- Report to the administration and nurses at their child(ren)'s respective school(s) if their child(ren) are symptomatic, have tested positive, or were in close contact with an infected individual outside of school.
- Diligently complete the daily health screener for their child(ren) every morning.
- Provide their child(ren) with a mask and remind them to wear it appropriately in school.
- Remind their child(ren) to practice appropriate hand hygiene
- Strongly consider participating in the school district's testing and vaccination programs.

That being said, please remember that, as part of our district's <u>Safe Return Plan</u>, this Wednesday, January 5, 2022 we will resume voluntary staff/family and student/family COVID-19 testing with Back to School Solutions from 2:30 – 5 pm and voluntary vaccinations with the Parlin Pharmacy from 4 -7 pm in the Sayreville War Memorial High School Cafeteria. Please also note that the pharmacy is also providing Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson and Johnson <u>booster</u> shots. Likewise, they are now also providing vaccinations for children <u>5</u> years of age and older. However, in accordance with the CDC and NJDOH it is recommended that parents <u>consult with their child's pediatrician prior to getting them vaccinated, especially those under that age of 12</u>. Below, please find the tentative dates for both of these services throughout the fall. With regard to testing, since we do not test people who are demonstrating symptoms, if you are symptomatic, you should ask your healthcare provider for an appropriate testing location. If you are a staff member or the parent of a student who is interested in learning more information about how you and your residing family members can participate in this vital virus spreading prevention activity, click here. Please note that if you have already participated in testing with us, you only need to conduct a telemedicine appointment. If you have never tested with us in the past, you would need to register using the following link <u>https://backtoworksolutions.com/SayervillePSD.html</u>. Once you have conducted your telemedicine appointment, you will receive a prescription for the PCR test.

As mentioned above the Parlin Pharmacy will once again administer Flu and COVID-19 Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson and Johnson vaccine shots to anyone 5 years of age and older, as well as Pfizer, Moderna, and J&J booster shots, in the Sayreville War Memorial High School Cafeteria. Naturally, any individuals under the age of 18 will need to be accompanied by a parent/guardian, who will need to provide signed consent for the vaccination. Therefore, anyone interested in receiving the vaccine must register online in advance by clicking here or by going to the Parlin Pharmacy website (www.parlinrx.com). Unfortunately, for safety purposes, no "walk-ins" will be permitted into the school. In fact, with in-district COVID-19 testing, all registered participants must report to Door 22 of the high school cafeteria (adjacent to the dumpsters), where they will be screened by our security team before being allowed into the vaccination room.
