Talk Sup Week 23 Review and Preview

February 21, 2022

Good afternoon Sayreville and happy Presidents' Day! I hope you are having a relaxing holiday weekend. Welcome to another edition of Talk Sup. Naturally, our schools were **closed** for instruction today, **February 21st** in observance of Presidents' Day.

With the recent surge in COVID-19 cases, we continue to request that parents:

- **Do not send their child(ren) to school if they are symptomatic.**
- **Report to the administration and nurses at their child(ren)'s respective school(s) if their child(ren) are symptomatic, have tested positive, or were in close contact with an infected individual outside of school.**
- **Diligently complete the daily health screener for their child(ren) every morning.**
- **Provide their child(ren) with a mask and remind them to wear it appropriately in school.**
- **Remind their child(ren) to practice appropriate hand hygiene**
- **Strongly consider participating in the school district's testing and vaccination programs.**

That being said, please remember that, as part of our district's [Safe Return Plan](#), this **Wednesday, February 23, 2022** we will resume **voluntary** staff/family and student/family **COVID-19 testing** with Back to School Solutions from **2:30 – 5 pm** and **voluntary vaccinations** with the Parlin Pharmacy from **4 -7 pm** in the **Sayreville War Memorial High School Cafeteria**. Please also note that the pharmacy is also providing **Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson and Johnson booster** shots. **Likewise, they are now also providing vaccinations for children 5 years of age and older. However, in accordance with the CDC and NJDOH it is recommended that parents consult with their child's pediatrician prior to getting them vaccinated, especially those under that age of 12.** Below, please find the tentative dates for both of these services throughout the fall. With regard to testing, since **we do not test people who are demonstrating symptoms**, if you are symptomatic, you should ask your healthcare provider for an appropriate testing location. If you are a staff member or the parent of a student who is interested in learning more information about how you and your residing family members can participate in this vital virus spreading prevention activity, click [here](#). **Please note** that if you have already participated in testing with us, you only need to conduct a telemedicine appointment. If you have never tested with us in the past, you would need to register using the following link <https://backtoworksolutions.com/SayrevillePSD.html>. Once you have conducted your telemedicine appointment, you will receive a **prescription** for the **PCR** test.

As mentioned above the Parlin Pharmacy will once again administer **Flu and COVID-19 Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson and Johnson vaccine shots to anyone 5 years of age and older, as well as Pfizer, Moderna, and J&J booster shots, in the Sayreville War Memorial High School Cafeteria**. Naturally, **any individuals under the age of 18 will need to be accompanied by a parent/guardian, who will need to provide signed consent for the vaccination**. Therefore, anyone interested in receiving the vaccine **must register online in advance** by clicking [here](#) or by going to the **Parlin Pharmacy** website (www.parlinrx.com). Unfortunately, for safety purposes, **no "walk-ins" will be permitted into the school**. In fact, with in-district COVID-19 testing, **all registered participants must report to Door 22 of the high school cafeteria (adjacent to the dumpsters)**, where they will be screened by our security team before being allowed into the vaccination room. If you did not have a chance to attend the Board of Education (BOE) Business Meeting held on Tuesday, February 15th, here is what you missed. Stephanie Castellitto from Sayreville War Memorial High School (SWMHS) and Jayda Ronquillo from the Sayreville Middle School (SMS) began the meeting by providing their respective Student Council Representative to the Board of Education Reports. Next, Mr. Esposito expressed his opening remarks and Mr. Walsh shared a few district highlights. During the presentation portion of the meeting, the district resumed publicly reviewing and discussing the 2022-23 School District Budget with the following proposed budget presentations: [Buildings & Grounds](#) and [Transportation](#) Budgets. After each respective presentation, the administration answered questions asked by the Board about them, particularly their budget needs and wants. Click on each presentation to view them. The Board then moved the action items from the Superintendent's Report onto the Board Agenda and approved them all. To see the Agenda, click [here](#). To see the Agenda Addendum, click [here](#). Among other motions, on the Vision 2030 Finance and Infrastructure portion of the agenda, the BOE approved of several capital improvement projects to be submitted to the New Jersey Department of Education, for review and approval as "school facilities projects" with debt service aid state funding, which is consistent with its approved 2019 Long Range Facilities Plan; and for the Spiezle Architectural Group Inc, to make the submission on behalf of the district. In addition, it approved a three-year contract with Cablevision Lightpath, Inc. to provide internet services.

On the Personnel portion of the agenda, as well as other motions, the Board of Education accepted the retirements of Judith Berg-Friel, School Nurse at the Samsel Upper Elementary School, and Karen Swierczek, Teacher at the Eisenhower Elementary School, effective July 1, 2022. It also appointed new certificated and non-certificated staff for the 2021-22 school year. Likewise, the Board approved the transfer of non-certificated staff members for the 2021-22 school year.

During the Open Public Comment portion of the meeting, a community member inquired as to whether the district had side view cameras installed on buses in order to record video footage of vehicles going through bus stop signs to pass them when they are loading and unloading children. Another member of the community asked if the district planned to replace or upgrade the playground at the Selover School, and whether the upgrading of electrical grids in



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schools across the district would allow for air conditioning in each classroom of every school. Another community member expressed concerns about building a transportation complex off of Journey Mill Road because it was previously used as a landfill. Likewise, the same member expressed concerns about it being constructed off of Cheesequake Road due to potential traffic problems. Other members of the community expressed their opposition to the district not offering a private preschool in Sayreville a contract renewal and inquired about the specific reasons why. Similarly, another member asked if the opening of the Selover School as a preschool next year would eliminate the need for all private preschools in Sayreville for Project Before. Finally, other community members expressed their feedback on mask wearing for the district to take into consideration when making a decision on whether to continue it beyond March 7th. One such member of the community also inquired about why the district was waiting until March 4th and not making that decision now.

Likewise, during the Board Discussion portion of the meeting, the Superintendent provided an update on the location of the proposed transportation complex. In addition, Mr. Fernandez reviewed what was discussed during the last Finance and Infrastructure Committee Meeting, as did Mr. Walsh for the last Personnel Committee Meeting. Mrs. Bloom also shared news from the Middlesex County School Boards Association and Mr. Fernandez provided an update on happenings with the Sayreville/South Amboy Rotary Club. Finally, Mrs. Bloom inquired about when the railings at the high school will be painted and what the district was planning to do to address the concerns that she previously mentioned about the Bomber Stadium press box.

The next meeting will take place on **Tuesday, March 1st**. During this meeting, the district will make presentations on the proposed 2022-23 Technology and Human Resources Budgets. The agenda for this meeting will be posted on the district website on **Friday, February 25th**.
