Talk Sup Week 25 Review and Preview

March 7, 2022

Good morning Sayreville! I hope you had a relaxing weekend. Welcome to another edition of Talk Sup. Please remember that our **students** will be **dismissed early today** so that our staff can participate in professional development. Likewise, please remember that **today** the **wearing of masks** will be **optional** in our **school buildings** and on our **school buses**. With the making of mask wearing optional, we request that all members of our school community respect the decisions of staff, students, and parents with regard to whether they wear masks or not and to not engage in any behavior that may consciously or unconsciously question, ridicule, or persuade individuals to wear or not wear one.

Over the weekend, there were no reports of people testing positive for COVID-19. For more information on infections, click **here** to review our **Student** and **Staff** COVID-19 Dashboards.

We continue to request that parents:

- Do not send their child(ren) to school if they are symptomatic.
- Report to the administration and nurses at their child(ren)'s respective school(s) if their child(ren) are symptomatic, have tested positive, or were in close contact with an infected individual outside of school.
- Diligently complete the daily health screener for their child(ren) every morning.
- Provide their child(ren) with a mask and remind them to wear it appropriately in school.
- Remind their child(ren) to practice appropriate hand hygiene
- Strongly consider participating in the school district's testing and vaccination programs.

That being said, please remember that, as part of our district's Safe Return Plan, this Wednesday, March 9, 2022 we will resume voluntary staff/family and student/family COVID-19 testing with Back to School Solutions from 2:30 – 5 pm and voluntary vaccinations with the Parlin Pharmacy from 4 -7 pm in the Sayreville War Memorial High School Cafeteria. Please also note that the pharmacy is also providing Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson and Johnson booster shots. Likewise, they are now also providing vaccinations for children 5 years of age and older. However, in accordance with the CDC and NJDOH it is recommended that parents consult with their child's pediatrician prior to getting them vaccinated, especially those under that age of 12. Below, please find the tentative dates for both of these services throughout the fall. With regard to testing, since we do not test people who are demonstrating symptoms, if you are symptomatic, you should ask your healthcare provider for an appropriate testing location. If you are a staff member or the parent of a student who is interested in learning more information about how you and your residing family members can participate in this vital virus spreading prevention activity, click here. Please note that if you have already participated in testing with us, you only need to conduct a telemedicine appointment. If you have never tested with us in the past, you would need to register using the following link https://backtoworksolutions.com/SayervillePSD.html. Once you have conducted your telemedicine appointment, you will receive a prescription for the PCR test.

As mentioned above the Parlin Pharmacy will once again administer Flu and COVID-19 Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson and Johnson vaccine shots to anyone 5 years of age and older, as well as Pfizer, Moderna, and J&J booster shots, in the Sayreville War Memorial High School Cafeteria. Naturally, any individuals under the age of 18 will need to be accompanied by a parent/guardian, who will need to provide signed consent for the vaccination. Therefore, anyone interested in receiving the vaccine must register online in advance by clicking here

or by going to the Parlin Pharmacy website (www.parlinrx.com). Unfortunately, for safety purposes, no "walkins" will be permitted into the school. In fact, with in-district COVID-19 testing, all registered participants must report to Door 22 of the high school cafeteria (adjacent to the dumpsters), where they will be screened by our security team before being allowed into the vaccination room. If you did not have a chance to attend the Board of Education (BOE) Business Meeting held on Tuesday, March 1st, here is what you missed. Mr. Esposito expressed his opening remarks and Mrs. Bloom shared a few district highlights. During the presentation portion of the meeting, the Board honored and celebrated the 2021-22 SWMHS Girls Bowling Team for their Group 2

Central Jersey State Championship. The district also resumed publicly reviewing and discussing the 2022-23 School District Budget with the following budget presentations: <u>Technology/Security</u> and <u>Human Resources</u>. After each respective presentation, the administration answered questions by the Board about them, particularly their budget needs and wants. Click on each presentation to view them. The Board then moved the action items from the Superintendent's Report onto the Board Agenda and approved them all. To see the Agenda, click here. To see the Agenda, click here. Among other motions, on the Vision 2030 Finance and Infrastructure portion of the agenda, the BOE awarded the bid for mechanical upgrades at multiple schools to Burlew Mechanical, LLC as the lowest responsible bidder in the amount of \$525,000, to be paid for through the funding of the ESIP Program. Likewise, it rejected all bids received on February 22, 2022 for alternate HVAC upgrades at multiple schools in order to substantially revise the bid specifications and to ensure compliance with public-school contract law. In addition, it approved a contract with McCabe Environmental Services for the testing of asbestos air samples due to the renovations and HVAC upgrades at the Selover School in the amount of \$57,685.50, which will be paid for out of Capital Reserve; and at the Truman Elementary School for an amount not to exceed \$29,610, which will also be paid for out of Capital Reserve, due to the window replacement project there.

On the Student Achievement portion of the agenda, among other motions, the Board approved the Camp XL Extended School Year and Learning Acceleration at Camp XL Summer Programs at the Samsel Upper Elementary School and Cheesequake School from July 5, 2022 through August 4, 2022; and the Middle School Credit Completion Summer School program from July 5, 2022 to August 11, 2022. Likewise, among other motions, on the



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Governance portion of the agenda, the Board of Education approved the revised 2022-23 School District Calendar and the new 2023-24 School District Calendar. To view each, click on them. It also approved several new and revised BOE policies and regulations for a First Reading. Click on each of them too in order to read them. Finally, on the Personnel portion of the agenda, as well as other motions, the Board of Education accepted the retirements of Linda Zydzik, 5th Grade Teacher; Dana Giorgianni, Special Education Teacher; and Mary-Jane Kerr, Paraprofessional at the Samsel Upper Elementary School, effective July 1, 2022. It also approved the transfer of non-certificated staff members for the 2021-22 school year.

During the Open Public Comment portion of the meeting, a community member introduced himself as the 2nd liaison to the Borough Council and provided a brief comment about the upcoming Special Joint BOE/Borough Council Meeting on March 7th. He also inquired if the district will make mask wearing optional on March 7th.

Likewise, during the Board Discussion portion of the meeting, the Superintendent provided an update on the location of the proposed transportation complex. In addition, Mrs. Bloom reviewed what was discussed during the last Student Achievement Committee Meeting, as did Mrs. Pieloch for the last Governance Committee Meeting. Mrs. Bloom also shared news from the Middlesex County School Boards Association and Mr. Fernandez provided an update on happenings with the Sayreville/South Amboy Rotary Club.

The next meeting will be **this evening**. It will be a **Special Joint BOE/Borough Council Meeting** for the purpose of discussing possible locations for the aforementioned transportation complex. After that, the next BOE business meeting will be on **Tuesday**, **March 15**th. During it the Board will honor and celebrate the 2022 Sayreville Middle School (SMS) Cheer Team for winning the NJCDCA Championship. In addition, it will vote on the 2022-23 Tentative School District Budget. The agenda for this meeting will be posted on the district website on **Friday**, **March 11**th. A complete copy of the **March 1**st meeting minutes will be posted on the BOE Meeting Minutes page of the website once they are approved by the BOE during the next BOE Meeting on **March 15**, **2022**.

As mentioned above, tomorrow evening at **7:00 pm**, there will be a **Special Joint Board of Education (BOE) and Borough Council Meeting** in the Sayreville War Memorial High School (SWMHS) Cafeteria. During it, the BOE and Borough Council will discuss the available property within the Borough that may be appropriate for the construction of a transportation complex. 
