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Talk Sup Week 30 Review and Preview

April 11, 2022

Good morning Sayreville! I hope you had a relaxing weekend. Welcome to another edition of Talk Sup.

As you probably know, **Thursday, April 28, 2022**, is designated as "**Bring Your Child to Work Day**." This activity is in conjunction with the national observance of "Take Our Daughters and Sons to Work Day" and is designed to help children ages **8-18** explore the workforce. Therefore, we anticipate that some of our students will be accompanying their parents/guardians to work on this day. Likewise, we anticipate that staff members will be taking their children to work for the same reasons. As we have done in the past, the parents of our students aged 8-18 that wish for their child(ren) to participate in this event at their place of employment and for them to receive credit for attending school, will be required to have their employer complete a form indicating their child(ren)'s participation and return it to their child(ren)'s school by **Tuesday, April 26, 2022**. Similarly, staff members who wish to take their child(ren) aged 8-18 to school will also need to complete a form and submit it to their immediate supervisor and/or building principal by April 26th. Our hope is that our students and the children of our staff members will benefit from the experience of "Bring Your Child to Work Day" and have the ability to enjoy spending time with a parent/guardian in their workplace.

This past week the New Jersey Department of Education released the 2020-2021 New Jersey School Performance Reports. They are available on the "District Page" of our website and the NJ School Performance Reports webpage at <https://rc.doe.state.nj.us/selectreport/2020-2021/23/4660> for review. In addition, this week each individual school's report will be posted on their respective websites. If you are not aware of it, the School Performance Reports reflect the NJDOE's commitment to providing parents, students, and school communities with a large variety of information about each school and district. They can be used as a tool to help evaluate whether all students have equitable access to high quality education. While some data that was missing in 2019-2020 will be available again for 2020-2021 (e.g. attendance data), other data continues to remain unavailable or look different from prior years. The NJDOE also recognizes that the existing data cannot begin to measure the hard work and perseverance of the students, families, educators, and community members during these two very challenging school years.

Notes are included throughout the School Performance Reports to explain where data is missing or impacted by COVID-19 and an updated [Impact of COVID-19 on Data Availability resource](#) is available to summarize this information. The 2020-2021 reports include changes that respond to stakeholder feedback, updated federal and state requirements, and the COVID-19 pandemic. In fact, they include:

- **New career and college readiness data** including Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), and dual enrollment participation by student group and work-based learning participation;
- **Expanded staff data** including staff counts and information about teachers by subject area, as requested by stakeholders;
- **New apprenticeship data** that shows how many students register in apprenticeship programs after high school graduation; and
- **Links to additional data** such as Start Strong assessment results and opportunity to learn data, which includes information about learning environments and device data during the 2020-2021 school year.

Educating Today's Learners to Be Tomorrow's Leaders

Due to some inflammatory postings on social media last week, multiple parents have inquired about the new New Jersey State Learning (NJSL) Health and Physical Education Standards, which are required to be implemented this September, 2022. Thus, as we have been reporting publicly since the New Jersey Department of Education released these new standards, when the revisions to our district K-12 Health and Physical Education Curriculum have been completed and approved by the Board in either June or July, we will share the new curriculum with the community and provide parents with detailed instructions as to how to request from their child(ren)'s principal that their child(ren) be given an alternative assignment so that he or she does not have to participate in lessons and/or activities that conflict with their religious and/or family virtues, values, and beliefs. Furthermore, we can assure you that despite what the standards may state, the district and board of education will not subject our students to any content that we determine to be profane or inappropriate in accordance with their age and/or grade-level.



In **176** days, residents in Sayreville will have the opportunity to *Cool the Schools* when they vote on the **Facilities Improvement Bond Referendum**, which is scheduled to be voted on by the Sayreville community on **October 4, 2022**. Over the weekend, it was reported to us that one individual from the Arleth School tested and one from the Food Services Department has tested positive for COVID-19. After conducting contact tracing in accordance with New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH) guidelines, individuals from Food Services were determined to be in “close contact” with the infected person. Today staff and parents **no longer have to complete the Oncourse daily health screening surveys**. However, we continue to request that parents:

- **Do not send their child(ren) to school if they are symptomatic.**
- **Report to the administration and nurses at their child(ren)'s respective school(s) if their child(ren) are symptomatic, have tested positive, or were in close contact with an infected individual outside of school.**
- **Remind their child(ren) to practice appropriate hand hygiene**
- **Strongly consider participating in the school district's testing and vaccination programs.**

Please remember that the Parlin Pharmacy is graciously offering all **Sayreville Public Schools staff, students and family members COVID-19 home rapid test kits** for no or little out of pocket cost. While most insurances cover home rapid test kits at no cost, unfortunately we have learned that there are certain insurances which may not. However, if your insurance policy does not cover them, the pharmacy is offering our staff, students and family members a special price of **\$9.99 per kit**. Furthermore, while some policies may not immediately cover the cost of the kit, they may provide full reimbursement upon the submission of a receipt, which will be provided by the pharmacy. 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cafeteria at the Sayreville War Memorial High School on Wednesday afternoons from 4:00 – 4:30 pm. As previously reported by me, **staff** test kits **will be delivered to the school designated in orders**. Please also remember that, as part of our district's [Safe Return Plan](#), this **Wednesday, April 13, 2022** we will resume **voluntary** staff/family and student/family **COVID-19 testing** with Back to School Solutions from **2:30 – 5 pm** and **voluntary vaccinations** with the Parlin Pharmacy from **4 -7 pm** in the **Sayreville War Memorial High School Cafeteria**. Please also note that the pharmacy is also providing **Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson and Johnson booster** shots. **Likewise, they are now also providing vaccinations for children 5 years of age and older. However, in accordance with the CDC and NJDOH it is recommended that parents consult with their child's pediatrician prior to getting them vaccinated, especially those under that age of 12.** Below, please find the tentative dates for both of these services throughout the fall. With regard to testing, since **we do not test people who are demonstrating symptoms**, if you are symptomatic, you should ask your healthcare provider for an appropriate testing location. If you are a staff member or the parent of a student who is interested in learning more information about how you and your residing family members can participate in this vital virus spreading prevention activity, click [here](#). **Please note** that if you have already participated in testing with us, you only need to conduct a telemedicine appointment. If you have never tested with us in the past, you would need to register using the following link <https://backtoworksolutions.com/SayervillePSD.html>. Once you have conducted your telemedicine appointment, you will receive a **prescription** for the **PCR** test.

As mentioned above the Parlin Pharmacy will once again administer **Flu and COVID-19 Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson and Johnson vaccine shots to anyone 5 years of age and older, as well as Pfizer, Moderna, and J&J booster shots, in the Sayreville War Memorial High School Cafeteria**. Naturally, **any individuals under the age of 18 will need to be accompanied by a parent/guardian, who will need to provide signed consent for the vaccination**. Therefore, anyone interested in receiving the vaccine **must register online in advance** by clicking [here](#) or by going to the **Parlin Pharmacy** website (www.parlinrx.com). Unfortunately, for safety purposes, **no "walk-ins" will be permitted into the school**. In fact, with in-district COVID-19 testing, **all registered participants must report to Door 22 of the high school cafeteria (adjacent to the dumpsters)**, where they will be screened by our security team before being allowed into the vaccination room.
