Please remember that the Parlin Pharmacy is graciously offering all Sayreville Public Schools staff, students and family members COVID-19 home rapid test kits for no or little out of pocket cost. While most insurances cover home rapid test kits at no cost, unfortunately we have learned that there are certain insurances which may not. However, if your insurance policy does not cover them, the pharmacy is offering our staff, students and family members a special price of \$9.99 per kit. Furthermore, while some policies may not immediately cover the cost of the kit, they may provide full reimbursement upon the submission of a receipt, which will be provided by the pharmacy. All student and family test kits will be available for pick up in the cafeteria at the Sayreville War Memorial High School on Wednesday afternoons from 4:00 – 4:30 pm. Please also remember that, as part of our district's <u>Safe Return Plan</u>, this <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>March 30</u>, 2022 we will resume <u>voluntary</u> staff/family and student/family <u>COVID-19</u> testing with Back to School Solutions from 2:30 – 5 pm and <u>voluntary</u> vaccinations with the Parlin Pharmacy from 4 -7 pm in the <u>Sayreville War Memorial High School Cafeteria</u>. Please also note that the pharmacy is also providing <u>Pfizer</u>, <u>Moderna</u>, and <u>Johnson and Johnson booster</u> shots. <u>Likewise</u>, they are now also providing vaccinations for children <u>5</u> years of age and older. <u>However</u>, in accordance with the <u>CDC</u> and <u>NJDOH</u> it is recommended that parents <u>consult with their child's pediatrician prior to getting them vaccinated</u>, <u>especially those under that age of 12</u>. Below, please find the tentative dates for both of these services throughout the fall. With regard to testing, since <u>we do not test people who are demonstrating symptoms</u>, if you are symptomatic, you should ask your healthcare provider for an appropriate testing location. If you are a staff member or the parent of a student who is interested in learning more information about how you and your residing family members can participate in this vital virus spreading prevention activity, click <u>here</u>. <u>Please note</u> that if you have already participated in testing with us, you only need to conduct a telemedicine appointment. If you have never tested with us in the past, you would need to register using the following link <a href="https://backtoworksolutions.com/SayervillePSD.html">https://backtoworksolutions.com/SayervillePSD.html</a>. Once you have conducted your telemedicine appointment, you will receive a **prescription** for the **PCR** test.

As mentioned above the Parlin Pharmacy will once again administer Flu and COVID-19 Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson and Johnson vaccine shots to anyone 5 years of age and older, as well as Pfizer, Moderna, and J&J booster shots, in the Sayreville War Memorial High School Cafeteria. Naturally, any individuals under the age of 18 will need to be accompanied by a parent/guardian, who will need to provide signed consent for the vaccination. Therefore, anyone interested in receiving the vaccine must register online in advance by clicking <a href="here">here</a> or by going to the Parlin Pharmacy website (<a href="here">www.parlinrx.com</a>). Unfortunately, for safety purposes, no "walkins" will be permitted into the school. In fact, with in-district COVID-19 testing, all registered participants must report to Door 22 of the high school cafeteria (adjacent to the dumpsters), where they will be screened by our security team before being allowed into the vaccination room. 
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


