Talk Sup Week 4 Review and Preview

October 4, 2021

Good morning Sayreville! I hope you had a most relaxing and enjoyable weekend. Welcome to another edition of Talk Sup. Please note that this week our students in grades 4-12 will participate in the New Jersey Start Strong Assessment. Please also remember that we will **dismiss students early** on **Monday, October 11**th so that staff can participate in professional development. Lastly, if you are interested, this Friday is Homecoming in Bomber Stadium. In addition, on Saturday the Sayreville War Memorial High School (SWMHS) Marching Band, which finished 5th during another competition last week, will host the annual Night of a Thousand Stars Band Competition in Bomber Stadium. Check out their <u>promotional</u> trailer.

As mentioned above, Sayreville will be administering the Start Strong assessments to students in grades 4 – 12 starting this Monday, October 4th through October 15th (see schedule below). Students will take a 45 to 60-minute assessment in English-Language Arts and in Mathematics. Students in grade 6, 9 and 12 will also take a Science assessment. As with regular state testing, students who are permitted extra time or other accommodations as per their 504 assistance plan or individualize education program (IEP) will have access to those accommodations on the Start Strong.

As you may or may not know, because last past spring New Jersey students did not participate in the statewide student achievement testing program, the New Jersey Student Learning Assessments (NJSLA), due to the impact of Covid-19, the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) notified districts that the administration of the Start Strong assessments in the fall 2021 will satisfy the federal statewide assessment requirement to administer general assessments in English language arts (ELA), mathematics, and science for the 2020-2021 school year. The Start Strong assessments are intentionally brief, as they are designed to maximize instructional time and quickly provide critical data to teachers and school leaders. The district will also have immediate access to student results, which will allow our teachers the flexibility to address students' unique needs at the beginning of the school year. These assessments are in addition to our normal, local assessments, which will also give us needed data on student growth and progress from the past year.

Parents/Guardians will be provided with an Individual Student Report (ISR) following the close of the assessment window at the end of October. The ISR will provide parents with a sense of their child's understanding in the tested content areas; a description of the major concepts that were tested; and a starting point for discussions with their child and his/her teacher(s) about areas where she/he may need additional support. Please remember that, as part of our district's <u>Safe Return Plan</u>, this Wednesday we will resume **voluntary** staff/family and student/family **COVID-19 testing** with Back to School Solutions from **2:30 – 5 pm** and **voluntary vaccinations** with the Parlin Pharmacy from **4 -7 pm** in the <u>Sayreville War Memorial High School Cafeteria</u>. Please also note that individuals <u>65 years of age and older</u>, as well as those <u>18 years of age and up with</u> complicated middle conditions or those who work in a high transmission risk occupation, including <u>all school district employees</u>, are now eligible for a <u>Pfizer booster shot if they were previously vaccinated</u> with the <u>Pfizer vaccine</u>. Below, please find the tentative dates for both of these services throughout the fall. With regard to testing, since we do not test people who are demonstrating symptoms, if you are symptomatic, you should ask your healthcare provider for an appropriate testing location. If you are a staff member or the parent of a student who is interested in learning more information about how you and your residing family members can participate in this vital virus spreading prevention activity, click here. Please note that if you have already participated in testing with us, you only need to conduct a telemedicine appointment. If you have never tested with us in the past, you would need to register using the following link https://backtoworksolutions.com/SayervillePSD.html. Once you have conducted your telemedicine appointment, you will receive a **prescription** for the **PCR** test.

As mentioned above the Parlin Pharmacy will once again administer Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson and Johnson vaccine shots to anyone 12 years of age and older, as well as Pfizer booster shots to applicable people (see above), in the Sayreville War Memorial High School Cafeteria. Naturally, any individuals under the age of 18 will need to be accompanied by a parent/guardian, who will need to provide signed consent for the vaccination. Therefore, anyone interested in receiving the vaccine must register online in advance by clicking here or by going to the Parlin Pharmacy website. Unfortunately, for safety purposes, no "walk-ins" will be permitted into the school. In fact, with in-district COVID-19 testing, all registered participants must report to Door 22 of the high school cafeteria (adjacent to the dumpsters), where they will be screened by our security team before being allowed into the vaccination room.
