#### Talk Sup Week 15 Review and Preview

December 20, 2021



Good morning Sayreville! I hope you had a wonderful holiday weekend. Welcome to another edition of Talk Sup. We would like to wish all our staff, students, and their parents a very happy holidays and wonderful New Year! Please remember that our <u>students and staff will be dismissed early</u> on **Thursday**, **December 23<sup>rd</sup>** so that they can get a head start on the holiday recess, which will begin on **Friday**, **December 24<sup>th</sup>**. Thus, please note that our <u>schools will be **closed**</u> for instruction from **December 24<sup>th</sup> through December 31<sup>st</sup>**.

As we all know, the holiday season is a time for giving. However, it is also a time to recognize and demonstrate our appreciation for the wonderful gifts that have been bestowed upon us. That said, I am forever grateful to be able to serve such a wonderful school district and community. In fact, I am humbled to have the opportunity to work with the most polished, hard-working, and dedicated administrators, teachers,

paraprofessionals, and support staff members. Furthermore, I feel blessed to be able to bear the fruit of our labor and witness the growth and remarkable development of our amazing students. They truly are the gift that keeps on giving. Hence, on behalf of the Sayreville Board of Education and Administration, we wish you and your entire family a blessed and very happy holidays. Over the weekend, it was reported to us that four individuals from the high school, three from the middle school, two from the Project Before at Samsel School, one from the Samsel Upper Elementary School (SUES), and one from our Transportation Department have tested positive for COVID-19. After conducting contact tracing in accordance with Center for Disease Control (CDC) and New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH) guidelines, individuals from the high school, middle school and SUES were determined to be in "close contact" with the infected people. At this time, all should have been notified and directed to quarantine. Speaking of quarantining, as you probably have heard, last Thursday the New Jersey Department of Health changed it guidelines for quarantining individuals in schools who were determined to be in "close contact" with an individual infected with COVID-19. Therefore, **effective today**, anyone who is determined to be a close contact will have to quarantine for **10 days** from school, but if they take a **PCR** (not a rapid) test **no sooner than five days** after their last date of contact with the infected individual and receive a negative PCR (not a rapid) test result, they can return after **7 days**. See the chart below.

### **New Close Contact Quarantine Guidelines**

10 days without testing

OR

7 days with negative PCR test results collected at 5-7 days

20 days if the individual cannot isolate from the infected person

Although the Center for Disease Control also endorsed "Test to Stay" programs for schools, the New Jersey Department of Education has not released any guidance on it as of yet. If you are not familiar with Test to Stay, it is a program that combines contact tracing and serial testing (testing that is repeated at least twice during a seven-day period post-exposure) to allow asymptomatic school-associated close contacts who are not fully vaccinated and do not test positive for SARS-CoV-2 to continue in-person learning. Nonetheless, With the recent and very large spike in COVID-19 cases, we implore all the parents of our students to <u>not</u> send your child(ren) to school if they or anyone in your household is <u>symptomatic</u>.

Please also remember that, as part of our district's **Safe Return Plan**, this **Wednesday**, we will resume **voluntary** staff/family and student/family **COVID-19 testing** with Back to School Solutions from **2:30 – 5 pm** and **voluntary vaccinations** with the Parlin Pharmacy from **4 - 7 pm** in the **Sayreville War Memorial High School Cafeteria**. Please also note that the pharmacy is also providing **Pfizer**, **Moderna**, and **Johnson and Johnson <u>booster</u>** shots. **Likewise**, **they are now also providing vaccinations for children <u>5</u> years of age and older. However, in accordance with the CDC and NJDOH it is recommended that parents <u>consult with their child's pediatrician prior to getting them vaccinated</u>, <u>especially those under that age of 12</u>. Below, please find the tentative dates for both of these services throughout the fall. With regard to testing, since we do not test people who are demonstrating symptoms, if you are symptomatic, you should ask your healthcare provider for an appropriate testing location. If you are a staff member or the parent of a student who is interested in learning more information about how you and your residing family members can participate in this vital virus spreading prevention activity, click <u>here</u>. <b>Please note** that if you have already participated in testing with us, you only need to conduct a telemedicine appointment. If you have never tested with us in the past, you would need to register using the following link <a href="https://backtoworksolutions.com/SayervillePSD.html">https://backtoworksolutions.com/SayervillePSD.html</a>. Once you have conducted your telemedicine appointment, you will receive a **prescription** for the **PCR** test.

As mentioned above the Parlin Pharmacy will once again administer Flu and COVID-19 Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson and Johnson vaccine shots to anyone 5 years of age and older, as well as Pfizer, Moderna, and J&J booster shots, in the Sayreville War Memorial High School Cafeteria. Naturally, any individuals under the age of 18 will need to be accompanied by a parent/guardian, who will need to provide signed consent for the vaccination. Therefore, anyone interested in receiving the vaccine must register online in advance by clicking <a href="here">here</a> or by going to the Parlin Pharmacy website (<a href="www.parlinrx.com">www.parlinrx.com</a>). Unfortunately, for safety purposes, no "walkins" will be permitted into the school. In fact, with in-district COVID-19 testing, all registered participants must report to Door 22 of the high school cafeteria (adjacent to the dumpsters), where they will be screened by our security team before being allowed into the vaccination room. 


the Sayreville Police and Fire Departments for their assistance and immeasurable contribution to the event.
