

Athletic Clearance

All RHS students interested in playing sports must complete the following prior to playing a sport:

- √ Freshmen without a 2.0 G.P.A in 3rd trimester of their 8th grade year will need to wait 6 weeks to participate in any sport.
- √ Have a 2.0 G.P.A. to be eligible to play a sport.
- √ Show proof of medical insurance (your own personal or you can buy from the school).
- √ Complete the athletic clearance card before trying out for a sport.
- √ Turn in a completed and signed athletic code of conduct form.
- √ Complete a sports physical.
- √ Free Physicals at RHS: July 11th to 15th 2022.

Dress Code

Students are encouraged to "Dress for Success" at RHS. Students and parents should read through the school dress code policy before buying clothes for the start of the school year. You can find a complete dress code guide in the student handbook on the RHS website: www.rhs.kcusd.com under the student menu. The transition center is also happy to answer any questions you might have about the dress code.

ID's

- Are required to be shown upon request of any RHS staff member.
- You can buy an ID in the finance office.

HS Dress Code

- All Caps (with RHS logo only), visors, hoods must be removed when entering a building.
- Bandanas are not allowed.

UPPER GARMENTS

- Bare midriffs and bare sides should not show even when arms are extended above the head
- Garments and/or jewelry which display or suggest sexual, vulgar, drug, alcohol, or tobacco-related wording / graphics may not be
- Clothing that is too tight or revealing is unacceptable.
- Undergarments Must remain entirely covered at all times.
- Strapless wear, tube tops, halter tops, tank tops, spaghetti straps, muscle shirts, and see through shirts are not permitted.
- Shirts with shoulder straps less than two (2) inches wide are not

LOWER GARMENTS

- Undergarments Must remain entirely covered even while seated.
- Hemlines of shorts, dress, skirts, and shorts shall be no shorter than mid-thigh or fingertip length.
- Clothing that is too tight or revealing is unacceptable
- If leggings or tights are worn, the student's shirt or shorts worn with them must be at least mid-thigh.
- No holes above fingertip length.

OTHERS

- No Cell Phone Use In The Classroom
- Phones / head phones need to be put away and not visible during class time
- Cell Phones / headphones are to be used before school, break, lunch and afterschool only
- Portable music speakers are not permitted on campuses.

PE Uniforms

Students are <u>expected</u> to buy a white or grey shirt for \$12.00 and black shorts for \$12.00. You can purchase these items in the **Finance Office** located next to the Pirate Helm. During winter months students are allowed to wear black, white, or grey sweat pants and sweatshirts. Most students pay for their clothes during the summer when they pick up their class schedule.

PE Lockers

Each student will receive a lock and locker to store their belongings during the first week of school. It is important to keep your locker locked at all times and not share your combination with anyone. RHS is not responsible for any lost or stolen items.

Bus Transportation

Bus routes are available through the district's transportation office. You can reach them at **559-305-7065** or on the district webpage under Department & Transportation. Busses will drop off and pick up in the bus alley located at the back of the school.

Daily Schedule

RHS students are enrolled in 7 classes per semester with each class consisting of 50 minute periods. On a regular day students at RHS begin classes at 8:00 a.m. and end at 3:11p.m.

Tardy Sweeps

- ⇒ On the day of a Tardy Sweep all students coming in tardy need to report to the **LD's Office**
- ⇒ Any student out of class after the bell rings will receive **lunch detention &** a call home.
- ⇒ Students missing **20 minutes** of class or more will be considered **absent** from class.

Special Schedules

On certain days our school will have an extended lunch schedule or a special rally day schedule to celebrate an activity or event. These schedules are announced 2-3 days in advance. Stop by the **Transition Center** if you don't hear the announcements, or want to know the dress up days or special activities that are going on.

Everyday Counts

Student Attendance

Parents or legal guardians are requested to call the attendance office to notify the school of any absence or appointment. Voicemail is available 24 hours a day for these calls. If the call is not received by 8 a.m. the day after the absence, the absence will be considered unexcused. Unexcused absences can be replaced by attending Saturday school. Students with 9 or more absences in a period at the end of the semester will not receive their 5 semester credits. For more information on absences please refer to our RHS student handbook.

Saturday School

Saturday School will clear any absence without a proper legal document. Students will be assigned Saturday School after **7 period absences**.

(1 full day of absence)

Successful completion of one day of Saturday School will clear 7 period absences.

- ⇒ Location: RHS Cafeteria
- ⇒ Time: 8:00am-12:00pm (Don't be late)
- ⇒ Student ID & Homework is required
- ⇒ No Talking, Eating, Sleeping, or other distracting behaviors



Short Term Independent Study

Short term independent study is for students planning to miss 5 to 10 school days. Students are required to complete their school work and return it to the short term independent studies teacher. **Please call the attendance office 5 days before** a planned absence to receive the short term independent information.





PATH to Success

Credits

One major difference between middle school and RHS is the way students earn semester credits as opposed to the trimester grading period. At RHS, students must pass their classes with a "D" or better to earn class credit. "Keep in mind CSU & UC require a "C" or better."

RHS

- \Rightarrow Fall Semester (80 days)
- Spring Semester (98 days)
- 1 Class per semester = 5 Credits
- 7 Classes per semester = 35 Credits
- 2 Semesters = 70 Credits
- 265 Credits = High School Diploma
- \Rightarrow 2.0 Cumulative GPA = High School Graduation

*Cumulative = all 4 Years



Middle School

- Trimester 1 (58 days)
- Trimester 2 (61 days)
- Trimester 3 (61 days)
- No Credits Earned
- 2.0 GPA for Promotion



PATH to Success

Grades

Students taking an Honors level class or Advanced Placement (AP) class in a core academic area receive an extra grade point. You can have up to 8 semesters of augmentation added to your GPA. Students who want to apply to more prestigious UC/CSU and private universities are encouraged to take AP and Honors courses to make their applications more competitive.




Staying Connected
