 - This year, there will be a specific effort to continue with flexible meeting options for parents. These include the use of virtual meetings for conferences and meetings. When meetings occur in person, there will be childcare provided.
- 4. Edgerton will involve parents in the planning and review of the school improvement plan and the joint development of the schoolwide plan when applicable. If the schoolwide plan is not satisfactory to the parents, submit comments on the plan when submitted to the district. [Section 1114(b)]
 - August 2021, families were consulted on the Title I School Improvement Plan for the upcoming school year. Information was shared with families about the overarching goals for the year in our focus areas for the upcoming school year along with strategies that may be implemented. Families provided input on the family engagement plan. Parent survey results from last year were also considered.
