

Update: Library Services Available

Due to staffing needs related to opening the Remote Learning Program this year, our librarians needed to be temporarily assigned to classroom teaching. We recognize that this caused some upset and challenges for staff and families alike, and we want to be sure that everyone in our community knows that our intention is to fully restore all library positions for the 2020-21 school year.

In the meantime, we also want our families to know about the provisional supports and services that Alameda Free Library, as well – on a limited basis – our own schools, are providing during the pandemic, including:

- 1. Reserving and picking up library books at the Main Library
- 2. <u>Limited book delivery service</u> (specifically for people who cannot leave their homes due to health reasons)
- 3. Audio and eBook access
- 4. <u>Homework and research support</u> (including via Tutor.com)

School Site Services

Although most elementary librarians were reassigned, Lynn Kinsey, who normally works Maya Lin School's media specialist, is offering enrichment library education to 4th and 5th graders through a Library Google classroom. That instruction includes:

- Lessons, videos, and read alouds covering a variety of topics, including literary genres, digital citizenship, and coding
- Using Padlet so students can share text, videos, or photos of their ideas/ work

For this year, both the Encinal Jr. & Sr. High School and Alameda High School are also providing part-time supports, including:

- Limited book checkout
- 2. Some ebooks and audiobooks


Using their Clever portal, AUSD students can also access SORA, which allows students to access ebooks and audiobooks from both their school and local public library. No library card is required to access these collections. (See the flyer below for more information.)

Both schools plan to have resources for checking out books and providing research assistance in the second semester (more information to come on those provisions)
