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What is special education?

IDEA Definition: specially designed instruction, provided at no cost to parents, to meet the unique needs of a child with a disability, including instruction conducted in a classroom, in the home, in hospitals and institutions, and in other settings, and instruction in physical education.



What is Specially Designed Instruction (SDI)?


Specially Designed Instruction: Adapting as appropriate the *content, methodology or delivery* of instruction

- (i) to address the unique needs of a child that result from the child's disability; and
- (ii) to ensure access of the child to the general curriculum,

so that the child can meet the same educational standards of the public agency that apply to all children.



IDEIA [§300.39(b)(3)]



Where does a student receive special education services?

In the least restrictive environment.

"Children with disabilities should be educated with children who are nondisabled..."

When making a placement decision, the IEP team must consider the Least Restrictive Environment (LRE)


- The LRE mandate of the IDEA requires students with disabilities to receive their education in general education settings to the maximum extent appropriate.
- If a general education setting is not appropriate, the student is to receive his or her education in a setting with the least amount of segregation from the student's nondisabled peers.



Where does CCPS currently provide Special Education services?

- General education (with or without spec. ed. teacher or asst. support)
- Self-contained classes (with special ed. teacher/assistants, only students with disabilities)
- Special education regional programs (ISLE, Functional Skills, SLE, BDP, Special Pre-K, Special k)
- Public separate day school

LRE A= inside regular classroom 80% or more of the day










INCLUSIVE PRACTICES

WHAT IS INCLUSIVE EDUCATION?

Inclusive education is teaching and supporting ALL students in age-appropriate general education classes in their neighborhood schools, with high quality academic, social emotional, and behavioral instruction, interventions, and supports.









Inclusion is MEMBERSHIP and BELONGING
