



## Trips Out-of-Country General Information

Information Signed-Off by Parent and Student (three pages of form)-All covered with the Student Out-of-Country Travel Form-These topic are all covered in the form

Copies of Documents Needed from Parent and Student-Must have before travel!

1. Signed Out-Of-Country form
2. Passport photocopy (make two and keep one at home!)
3. Documentation from a health provider verifying “clean bill of health” OR Copy of this years’ forms from Activities Check-up.
4. Student’s personal medical/health insurance (includes info on how it responds in a foreign country).

### Personal Health Insurance Provider

Many, if not most, health insurance policies do not cover policyholders once they leave the United States. As a general rule, health plans do not cover injuries or illnesses in the course of traveling abroad, even for emergency care. Among the health plans that do not cover individuals abroad is Medicare.

Recommendation: Individuals should call their health insurance provider to check for summary of benefits and to get an international phone number to call in case they need approval for emergency care abroad.
