


# 2022 English Summer Reading Guide: English 2 College Prep

Kirsten Raymonde will never forget the night Arthur Leander, the famous Hollywood actor, had a heart attack on stage during a production of King Lear. That was the night when a devastating flu pandemic arrived in the city, and within weeks, civilization as we know it came to an end. Twenty years later, Kirsten moves between the settlements of the altered world with a small troupe of actors and musicians. They call themselves The Traveling Symphony, and they have dedicated themselves to keeping the remnants of art

depicting life before and after the pandemic, the strange twist of fate that connects them all will be revealed.





Warcross by Marie Lu



How far will you go to achieve a dream? That's the question a celebrated coach poses to Katie and Eric Knox after he sees their daughter Devon, a gymnastics prodigy and Olympic hopeful, compete. For the Knoxes there are no limits -- until a violent death rocks their close-knit gymnastics community and everything they have worked so hard for is suddenly at risk. As rumors swirl among the other parents, Katie tries frantically to hold her family together while also finding herself irresistibly drawn to the crime itself. What she uncovers --



about her daughter's fears, her own marriage, and herself -- forces Katie to consider whether there's any price she isn't willing to pay to achieve Devon's dream.

Yadriel has summoned a ghost, and now he can't get rid of him. When his traditional Latinx family has problems accepting his true gender, Yadriel becomes determined to prove himself a real brujo. With the help of his cousin and best friend Maritza, he performs the ritual himself, and then sets out to find the ghost of his murdered cousin and set it free. However, the ghost he summons is actually Julian Diaz, the school's resident bad boy, and Julian is not about to go quietly into death. He's determined to find out what happened and tie off some loose ends before he leaves. Left with no choice, Yadriel agrees to help



Julian, so that they can both get what they want. But the longer Yadriel spends with Julian, the less he wants to let him leave.



Long Way Down by Jason Revnolds

In this free-verse novel, it's been fewer than two days since narrator Will witnessed the shooting death of his older brother, Shawn. Now, according to the "rules" passed from father to son, brother to brother, revenge is the next order of business, and Carlon Riggs, a member of the Dark Suns gang, is in Will's crosshairs. Taking the gun jammed into Shawn's dresser, Will heads to the elevator on the seventh floor of his apartment building and presses the "L" button (which he and Shawn used to pretend stood for "loser" rather than "lobby") at 9:08:02 am. Before he reaches the lobby at 9:09:09, six ghosts will enter the elevator—victims,



perpetrators, or both, entangled in a chain of murder, misidentification, and revenge that led to Shawn's death.

# **Questions to Guide Reading and Annotating:**

#### Character

- → Which characters appear to be growing or changing? How do they change? Which stay the same?
- → What motivates the major characters to do what they do?
- → When has a character made a discovery or a realization about him/herself or the world he/she lives in?

### **Topic**

- → What issues does the book make the reader think about?
- → What ideas appear regularly or with a recurring pattern to them?
- → When has someone said or done something in the book that felt like it was part of a larger "life lesson"?

## **Author's Choices - Literary Elements**

- → Are there elements of the text that feel like representations of something larger than their literal value? What could they be representing?
- → Does a setting or an environment ever reflect thoughts or emotions occurring internally in one or more of the characters?
- → Does the author describe something in a way that suggests he/she is making a comment about life in general?

### **Takeaways**

→ What is something that you learned about people's experiences that you had not thought about before reading this book?
