Talk Sup Week 23 Review and Preview



February 15, 2021

Good morning Sayreville and happy President's Day! I hope you had a relaxing holiday weekend and Valentine's Day. Welcome to another edition of *Talk Sup Review and Preview*. As you know, our schools are closed today in observance of President's Day.





As has been the very fascinating pattern this winter, we have to contend with potentially hazardous weather later today through Thursday. According to the latest weather forecasts, rain and sleet will begin falling this evening and will extend through tomorrow morning, which may result in a treacherous morning commute. Therefore, while the latest forecasts are predicting that the sleet will change to rain by early tomorrow morning, since we cannot delay the opening of schools for in-

person instruction because we are already operating on an early dismissal schedule in accordance with our Restart of School Plan, if it does not and conditions are too icy, we may be forced to close schools for in person instruction. In addition, after a brief respite, another storm will arrive to our area on Wednesday that may also affect the opening of schools for in-person instruction on Thursday and potentially Friday. As always, we will we will do everything we can to give parents and staff as much advanced notice as possible about any school closures or schedule changes using our website (http://www.sayrevillek12.net), automated calling system, and district e-mail system. However, we also recommend that you check our Facebook page, Twitter account, and Instagram account, as well as News 12 New Jersey, and NJ 101.5.

Along with the COVID-19 positive cases that I reported to you and the community in my broadcast email last Friday, this weekend we received notification that one individual from District Transportation Services, one from the Project Before at Cheesequake School, and one from the Truman School have tested positive. After conducting contact tracing in accordance with Center for Disease Control (CDC) and New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH) guidelines, multiple individuals from the Truman School were determined to have been in "close contact" (within 6 feet for a total of 15 minutes in 24 hours) with the infected person there. By this time, the district should have formally notified and directed them to quarantine. Conversely, no individuals from the Cheesequake School or the district were determined to be in close contact with the other infected people. For the most up to date information on the number of individuals who have tested positive or who have been determined to be in close contact with a person who has tested positive, please see the Student and Staff COVID-19 Dashboards, which are located on the School Safety and Security of our website and can be accessed by clicking here.

As mentioned above, due to the potential snowstorm tomorrow evening though tomorrow (Tuesday, February 16th) morning, all students may have to participate in virtual instruction on Tuesday if we are forced to close our schools or delay their opening for office work. If hopefully not, tomorrow (**Tuesday, February 16th**) we will resume in-person instruction in **Phase 2b** for students in grades **K-5** and **Cohort C** (**preschool and MD/BD self-contained classrooms**), and **Phase 2a** for students in grades **6-12**. Therefore, on **Tuesday, February 16th** and **Friday**, **February 19th**, students in grades **K-5 Cohort A** will attend school for in-person instruction, while **K-5 Cohort B** does so this **Thursday**, **February 18th**. Likewise, students in grades **6-12 Cohorts A&B** will participate in in-person instruction on **Tuesday** and **Thursday**. Naturally, students in **Cohort C** (preschool and MD/BD self-contained classrooms) will attend school for in-person instruction on **Tuesday** and **Thursday**. 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As you may have already learned and read, the Center for Disease Control recently released updated guidance on the reopening of schools. In addition, the *New York Times* resonated the validity of the CDC guidance in a recent article, which you can also read by clicking <u>here</u>. Therefore, based upon the aforementioned guidance, as well as the descending positivity rate that has been trending since mid-January, later this week the district will be making and sharing its decision on when we will expand our current in-person learning schedule to Phase 3 for all students. Therefore, you will notice in the calendar below that we have not extended the schedule beyond the end of this month.
