Please remember that our schools will be closed for in-person instruction and there will be no virtual instruction from December 24, 2020 until January 1, 2021 for the holiday/winter recess. We will reopen on January 4, 2021 with virtual instruction for ALL students.

Along with the cases that I reported to you and the entire community last week, yesterday we received notification that a staff member from the Sayreville Middle School tested positive for COVID-19. We are currently in the process of conducting contact tracing in accordance with Center for Disease Control (CDC) and New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH) guidelines in order to determine if any individuals from the school were in close contact with the infected individual and therefore in need of quarantining for 14 days from the last date of contact with that person. If we determine any, later this morning those people will be formally notified. For the most up to date information on the number of individuals who have tested positive or who have been determined to be in close contact with a person who has tested positive, please see the Student and Staff COVID-19 Dashboards, which are located on the School Safety and Security of our website and can be accessed by clicking here.

This week all students will participate in virtual instruction on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday. When we return from the holiday recess, we will begin in-person instruction for all students during the week of January 4th in Phase 2a before transitioning the next (week of January 11th) to the current programming that we had last week, which was Phase 2b for students in grades K-5 and Cohort C (preschool and MD/BD self-contained classrooms), and Phase 2a for students in grades 6-12. If you did not have a chance to attend the Board of Education Business Meeting held on Tuesday, December 15th, here is what you missed. After Mr. Esposito's and Mr. Walsh's opening remarks about the leadership and social

media, and other district highlights, Stephen Farley from Sayreville War Memorial High School (SWMHS) and Haley Esseng from the Sayreville Middle School (SMS), provided their respective Student Council Representative to the Board of Education Reports. During the presentation portion of the meeting, Ms. Hill, Business Administrator, presented the 2020 Food Sayreville BOE Meeting 12-15-2020 Part 1 Services Fiscal Report and the proposed 2021-22 Food Services Enterprise Account Budget. The Board then moved the action items from the Superintendent's Report onto the Board Agenda and approved all of them. To see the Agenda click here. To see the Agenda Addendum click here. To view the video of this meeting,

Among other motions, on the Vision 2030 Finance and Infrastructure portion of the agenda, the Board of Education approved the acceptance of a grant from the Computer Science Teachers Association (CSTA) in the amount of \$500 for the Sayreville Computer Science Honor Society to support their proposed outreach service during Computer Science Education Week and ongoing society activities. Likewise, on the Student Achievement portion of the agenda, the Board of Education approved the inclusion of Computer Science Honors Society at Sayreville War Memorial High School with Ms. Atiyah Conry as the faculty advisor. Furthermore, it approved a partnership between Sayreville War Memorial High School and the Technology Student Association (TSA), which is a national, non-profit career and technical student organization of middle school and high school students who are engaged in STEM.

On the Governance portion of the agenda, among other motions, the BOE approved the appointment of Lori Ann Dobrzynski by the Borough of Sayreville Mayor and Council to serve as a Trustee for the Sayreville Public Library and the Sayreville Public faculty liaison with the public library for 2021. Finally, on the Personnel portion of the agenda, as well as other motions, the Board of Education appointed new certificated and non-certificated staff for the 2020-21 school year, and the transfer of non-certificated staff for the 2020-21 school year.

During open BOE discussion, the Board expressed sentiments of gratitude and well wishes for Mrs. Batko, Mrs. Pieloch, Mrs. Rubio, and Mr. Callahan, who will be stepping down from their seat on the Board of Education at the end of this month. When doing so, Mr. Esposito read a letter of gratitude for Mrs. Batko written by Kenneth Veres, President of the Sayreville Education Association. Additionally, Ms. Hill, Business Administrator, reviewed what was discussed during the last BOE Finance and Infrastructure Committee Meeting. Likewise, Ms. Kenney reviewed what was discussed during the most recent BOE Student Achievement Committee Meeting and Mr. Callahan did the same with regard to the last BOE Personnel Committee Meeting. Finally, Mrs. Bloom shared news from the Middlesex County School Boards Association.

The next meeting, which will be the Reorganization Meeting of the new 2021 Sayreville Board of Education, will be held on **Tuesday, January 5th**. During this meeting the newly elected Sayreville Board of Education Members will be officially sworn in. In addition, a short Business Meeting Agenda with motions for approval will also be presented to the new BOE. Both agendas for this meeting will be posted on the district website on **Friday, January 1st**. A complete copy of the **December 15th** meeting minutes will be posted on the BOE Meeting Minutes page of the website once they are approved by the BOE during the next BOE Meeting on **January 5, 2021**.
