Talk Sup Week 22 Review and Preview

February 8, 2021



Good morning Sayreville! I hope you had a relaxing weekend. Welcome to another edition of *Talk Sup Review and Preview*. As you know, **today** will participate in <u>virtual instruction</u>, as our schools and district will be <u>closed</u> for <u>in-person instruction</u>, <u>Leading Edge childcare</u>, <u>office work</u>, <u>meal deliveries</u>, and <u>after school activities</u>, including <u>athletics</u> taking place <u>in-district</u>, and <u>permitted events</u>. In addition, please remember that there will be **no teacher office hours** today so that our faculty can participate in professional development.

Along with the COVID-19 positive cases that I reported to you and the community in my broadcast email last Friday, this weekend we received notification that one individual from the Arleth Elementary School, one from the Eisenhower Elementary School, and one from the Wilson Elementary School have tested positive. After conducting contact tracing in accordance with Center for Disease Control (CDC) and New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH) guidelines, no individuals from any of the schools were determined to be in close contact with the infected people. As you know, due yesterday's snowstorm, today <u>all</u> students will participate in <u>virtual instruction</u>, as our schools and district will be <u>closed</u>. It is my hope that tomorrow (Tuesday, February 9th) we will be able to resume in-person instruction in <u>Phase 2b</u> for students in grades <u>K-5</u> and <u>Cohort C</u> (<u>preschool and MD/BD self-contained classrooms</u>), and <u>Phase 2a</u> for students in grades <u>6-12</u>. Therefore, on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>February 9th and <u>Friday</u>, <u>February 12th</u>, students in grades <u>K-5 Cohort A</u> will attend school for in-person instruction, while <u>K-5 Cohort B</u> does so this <u>Thursday</u>, <u>February 11th</u>. Likewise, students in grades <u>6-12 Cohorts A&B</u> will participate in in-person instruction on <u>Tuesday</u> and <u>Thursday</u>. Naturally, students in <u>Cohort C</u> (preschool and MD/BD self-contained classrooms) will attend school for in-person instruction on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>Thursday</u>, and <u>Friday</u>. If you did not have a chance to attend the virtual Board of Education (BOE) Business Meeting held on Tuesday,



January 19th, here is what you missed. Stephen Farley from Sayreville War Memorial High School (SWMHS) and Maeve Witte from the Sayreville Middle School (SMS) began the meeting by providing their respective Student Council Representative to the Board of Education Reports. After that, Mr. Esposito thanked all faculty and staff during his opening remarks and Mr. Walsh shared district highlights. The district then resumed publicly reviewing and discussing the 2021-22 School District Budget with the following budget presentations: Special Services, Transportation, and

The Board then moved the action items from the Superintendent's Report onto the Board Agenda and approved all of them. To see the Agenda click <u>here</u>. To see the Agenda Addendum click <u>here</u>. To view the video of this meeting, click <u>here</u>. Among other motions, on the Vision 2030 Finance and Infrastructure portion of the agenda, the



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Board approved the submission of the amended Coranavirus Aid Relief and Security Act (CARES Act) and Elementary Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund ESSER grant application, in which the total revised amount of the grant was increased from \$583,350 to \$636,361. It also approved the district's participation in the Project 10 Million Program grant in which T-Mobile will be providing 350 mobile hotspot devices to the district with 100GB of data per year for five years. These devices will be used to help ensure that all our students have internet connectivity at home.

On the Student Achievement portion of the agenda, among other motions, the Board approved new elective Unified Art, Unified Theatrical Arts, Unified Technology, and Unified Design Lab/STEAM courses at the Sayreville Middle School beginning with the 2021-2022 school year. Lastly, on the Personnel portion of the agenda, as well as other motions, the Board of Education appointed new certificated and non-certificated staff and approved the transfer of certificated and non-certificated staff members for the 2020-21 school year.

During the Open Discussion portion of the meeting, Mrs. Kenny reviewed what was discussed during the last Student Achievement Committee Meeting. Finally, Mrs. Bloom shared news from the Middlesex County School Boards Association.

The next meeting on **Tuesday, February 16th**. During it, the district will resume discussions on the 2021-22 Budget with the following presentations: Buildings and Grounds, Capital Projects, and Personnel. A complete copy of the **February 2nd** meeting minutes will be posted on the BOE Meeting Minutes page of the website once they are approved by the BOE during the next BOE Meeting on **February 16, 2021**.



Thanks to our magnificent teachers and instructional staff, our students continued to progress in learning and have a ton of fun doing so this past week. In Project Before, students had a blast playing in the



snow, making snow volcanos, and learning how to take care of their teeth. At the high school, students in Ms.

Mathias's Spanish 2 Class presented multimedia presentations on national

parks. At the middle school, students performed some deep thinking while reading powerful text like *Walk Two Moons* and snow inspired poetry, while others demonstrated how to solve mathematic number expressions with variables, and still others learned how various body systems work



together. Finally, at the Samsel Upper Elementary School, students took a virtual field trip to the

Super Bowl and made goalposts during a STEM activity.

This past week our students, staff, and community members continued to impress us with their amazing accomplishments. We commend and congratulate students on the Sayreville War Memorial High School (SWMHS) Health Occupations Students of American (HOSA) Chapter who competed in the New Jersey HOSA Southern Regional Conference.
