#### Talk Sup Week 19 Review and Preview

January 18, 2021

Good morning Sayreville and happy Martin Luther King Jr. Day! I hope you had a relaxing weekend. Welcome to another edition of *Talk Sup Review and Preview*. As you know, our **schools are <u>closed</u>** and there will be <u>no inperson or virtual instruction</u> today in observance of Martin Luther King Day.



As noted above, our schools are closed for in-person or virtual instruction today in observance and recognition of Dr. Martin Luther King Junior. Therefore, if you have the chance, please take a moment today to reflect upon and to discuss with your family the amazing accomplishments of Dr. King and the profound impact he has had on our nation and culture, particularly how he taught us how to appreciate the differences in others and to protest peacefully against prejudice and discrimination so as to ensure equality and equity

for all citizens of our great country, particularly people of color. More than ever, this message needs to resonate in our nation.

There are no new COVID-19 positive cases to report to you since my broadcast email to the entire community last Friday. This week we will resume in-person instruction in Phase 2½ for students in grades K-5 and Cohort C (preschool and MD/BD self-contained classrooms), and Phase 2½ for students in grades 6-12. Therefore, since there will be no in-person nor virtual instruction today due to the Martin Luther King holiday, tomorrow, January 19<sup>th</sup> and Friday, January 22<sup>nd</sup>, students in grades K-5 Cohort A will attend school for in-person instruction, while K-5 Cohort B does so on Thursday, January 21<sup>st</sup>. Likewise, students in grades 6-12 Cohorts A&B will participate in in-person instruction this Tuesday and Thursday. Naturally, students in Cohort C (preschool and MD/BD self-contained classrooms) will attend school for in-person instruction on Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. 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As you know, back in December New Jersey began vaccinating people for COVID-19 who were in what is referred to as Phase 1A, which consists of "healthcare personnel and long-term care residents and staff." Last week, it was announced that "first responders and individuals at high risk (65 years of age or older with compromising medical conditions, including pregnancy and weakened immune system)" in Phase 1B could register to receive their first dosage. I have been informed that the last group in Phase 1B "additional frontline essential workers," which includes school district personnel may be permitted to receive their first dose of the vaccination by the end of this month. Thus, no matter which phase you are in, if you have not already received or registered for a vaccine, I encourage you to preregister by clicking on the following link <a href="https://covidvaccine.nj.gov/">https://covidvaccine.nj.gov/</a>.

Please remember that all our staff, students, and their residing family members are strongly encouraged to participate in our free and easy-access COVID-19 <u>asymptomatic</u> testing on the dates and times noted below. Since we do <u>not</u> test people who are <u>demonstrating symptoms</u>, if you are symptomatic, you should ask your healthcare provider for an appropriate testing location.
