Talk Sup Week 31 Review and Preview

April 26, 2021

Good morning Sayreville! I hope you had a relaxing weekend. Welcome to another edition of *Talk Sup Review and Preview*.



We begin this issue by wishing all our administrative assistants and clerks a belated happy Administrative Assistant Day and Week! Likewise, we commend and thank them for all they do every day to assist in the efficient operation of the school district and/or their school or department. Likewise, we are forever grateful for the positive outcomes that they have either directly or indirectly promoted for all our students and staff. They are nothing less than AMAZING!

Over the weekend, we received notification that one individual from the Samsel Upper Elementary School (SUES) and one from the Arleth School have tested positive for COVID-19. After conducting contact tracing in accordance with Center for Disease Control (CDC) and New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH) guidelines, no individuals from either school were determined to be in “close contact” with the infected people. As you know, in preparation for the transition to **Phase 4** of our **Restart of School Plan** on **May 3rd**, this past Friday was the last day for parents to request from their child’s principal for their child(ren) to transition from either full-time remote learning back to in-person instruction or vice versa. Hence, if parents did not communicate a change, they will be locked into their child(ren)’s current learning environment until the end of the 2020-21 school year unless there are mitigating circumstances warranting a change.

This week, **all in-person learners in preschool through 12th grade**, will continue to attend school for in-person instruction following the early dismissal schedule in accordance with Phase 3 of our Restart of School Plan. Below please find the calendar for April, May, and June.

This past week the New Jersey Department of Education released the 2019-2020 New Jersey School Performance Reports. They are available on the “[District Page](#)” of our website and the NJDOE School Performance Reports webpage at <https://rc.doe.state.nj.us/> for review. In addition, this week each individual school’s report will be posted on their respective websites. If you are not aware of it, the School Performance Reports reflect the NJDOE’s commitment to providing parents, students, and school communities with a large variety of information about each school and district. They can be used as a tool to help evaluate whether all students have equitable access to high quality education. Unfortunately, the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic has had a significant impact on the way the NJDOE was able to measure school performance and student achievement, as some data is not available at all and other data, while available, may not look the same as it has in prior years. The NJDOE also recognizes that the existing data cannot begin to measure the hard work and perseverance of the students, families, educators, and community members during these two very challenging school years.

Nonetheless, while the past two school years have been unlike any other, the NJDOE still believes that it is critical to use the available data in the reports, along with other information collected directly within districts and communities, to ensure that all students receive the support and resources that they need. There are notes included throughout the reports to explain where data is missing or impacted by COVID-19, as well as the effect of COVID-19 on the data. Finally, the 2019-2020 reports include changes that respond to stakeholder feedback collected over the last several years and during the COVID-19 pandemic. These changes include a new report design with improved visuals and new navigational tools, additional data about graduation cohorts to provide more information about students who do not graduate, new resources to help explain the impact of COVID-19 on the availability of data in the reports, and a new narrative field, “Learning During COVID-19”, to give districts an opportunity to share information on how they responded to the COVID-19 pandemic.

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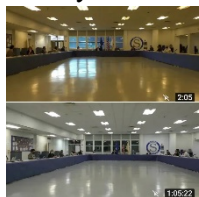
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Similarly, last week Dr. Shediack, Assistant Superintendent, reported to the school community the updated NJDOE guidance regarding the administration of the spring 2021 statewide assessments. As you may already know, the spring New Jersey State Learning Assessment (NJSLA) was cancelled. As an alternative, school districts will be required to administer the New Jersey Start Strong Assessment in English Language Arts (ELA), Math, and Science in the fall of 2021. Preliminary information about the Start Strong Assessment can be located at this [link](#). However, the United States DOE is still requiring the NJDOE to administer the ACCESS/Alternate ACCESS assessment for English Language Learners (ELL) and the Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) assessment for students with moderate to severe intellectual and pervasive developmental disabilities. Therefore, the administration of both will continue as scheduled for this spring. Below please see the testing window for all state assessments this spring and next fall.

If you did not have a chance to attend the Board of Education (BOE) Business Meeting held on Tuesday, April 20th, here is what you missed. Stephen Farley, from Sayreville War Memorial High School (SWMHS) and Haley Asseng from the Sayreville Middle School (SMS) began the meeting by providing their



respective Student Council Representative to the Board of Education Reports. After that, Mr. Esposito expressed his opening remarks and Mr. Walsh shared district highlights. During the presentation portion of the meeting, the Board recognized and honored the 2020-21 Sayreville War Memorial High School (SWMHS) Top 10 Students as well as this year's MCASA/MCSBA Unsung Heroes with certificates of commendation and appreciation.



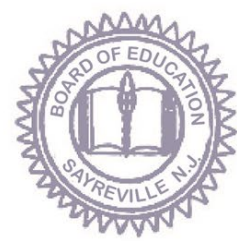
The Board then moved the action items from the Superintendent's Report onto the Board Agenda and approved them all. To see the Agenda click [here](#). To see the Agenda Addendum click [here](#). Among other motions, on the Vision 2030 Finance and Infrastructure portion of the agenda, the Board approved the submission of the Window Replacement at Truman Elementary School and the HVAC Upgrades at Selover School projects to the NJDOE for review and approval. The BOE also approved a contract with McCabe Environmental Services LLC for Environmental Inspections related to the HVAC Upgrades at Selover School in an amount not to exceed \$13,400, and approved to withdraw those funds from Capital Reserve. In addition, the Board of Education approved an agreement for professional services between the Board and the Spiezle Architectural Group, in which the Board will pay them \$24,500 for the professional services associated with the Wilson Elementary School Roof Replacement, which will be funded through the Energy Savings Improvement Program (ESIP). Similarly, the Board awarded the bid for mechanical upgrades at multiple Schools to Sunnyfield Corporation as the lowest responsible bidder in the amount of \$3,737,000, which will be paid for through the funding of the ESIP Program; and awarded the bid for roofing upgrades at the Selover and Wilson Schools to Strober-Wright Roofing, Inc., as the lowest responsible bidder in the amount of \$1,330,723, which will be paid for through the funding of the ESIP Program for the Wilson roof and local funds for the Selover roof. Furthermore it approved to withdraw from Capital Reserve \$746,558 for the roofing upgrades at the Selover School. Finally, the



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BOE approved a contract with Unique Musique Entertainment, Inc. for supplies and services related to hosting the Senior Prom, Junior Prom and 8th Grade Dance in an amount of \$43,850.

On the Student Achievement portion of the agenda, among other motions, the Board approved the Camp XL Extended School Year Integrated Summer Program and Learning Acceleration Summer Program at Camp XL at the Samsel Upper Elementary School from July 6, 2021 through August 5, 2021; the Middle School Credit Completion Summer School program at the Sayreville Middle School (SMS) from July 6 to August 12, 2021; and the Summer Enrichment Program at the Samsel Upper Elementary School from July 6, 2021 to August 6, 2021. It also approved the SMS Grade 8 Formal Dance on Wednesday, June 9, 2021; the SWMHS Junior Prom on Thursday, June 10, 2021; and the SWMHS Senior Prom on Friday, June 11, 2021, which will all be held from 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm at Sayreville War Memorial High School.

On the Governance portion of the agenda, among other motions, the BOE approved the revised 2020-2021 School District Calendar, which eliminates the three additional days of instruction built into it in anticipation of school closures due to hazardous weather and therefore ends the school year for students on June 18th and for teachers on June 21st. In addition, the Board approved the revised 2021 Summer Hours for 12-month employees, which moves the start date up for "Regular Summer Hours" due to the revision of the 2020-21 School District Calendar. It also approved the Teamsters Local 469 and Sayreville Education Association (SEA) Full Time Technicians Holiday Schedules for the 2021-2022 school year. Lastly, the Board of Education denied SEA Grievance 2020-21 #4.

Finally, on the Personnel portion of the agenda, as well as other motions, the Board of Education accepted the retirements of Claire Craft, Social Studies Teacher at SMS; Joseph Goscienski, Social Studies Teacher at SWMHS; Nancy Dellafave, Paraprofessional at the Truman School, and Ronald Twardos, Night Lead Custodian at SUES effective July 1, 2021. It also appointed new certificated and non-certificated staff for both the 2020-21 and 2021-22 school years. Furthermore, it approved the transfer of non-certificated staff members for the 2020-21 school year and to withhold the 2021-22 school year salary increment and employment adjustment increment for a staff member.

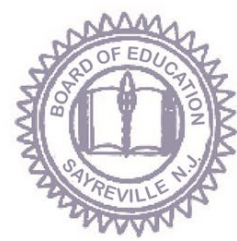
During the Open Discussion portion of the meeting, Mr. Balka reviewed what was discussed during the last Finance and Infrastructure Committee Meeting, as did Mr. Walsh for the last Personnel Committee Meeting and Mrs. Kenny for the last Student Achievement Committee Meeting. Mrs. Bloom also shared news from the Middlesex County School Boards Association.

The next meeting will be on **Tuesday, May 4th**. During this meeting the district will hold the mandatory hearing on the 2021-22 School District Budget. In addition, the Board will recognize and honor the Sayreville Middle School (SMS) Competition Cheer Team for their New Jersey Cheer and Dance Coaches Association Championship. Likewise, they will honor the SWMHS Distributive Education Clubs of America (DECA) and Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) students who won state championships, as well as the students on the SMS Odyssey of the Mind Team who also won a state championship. 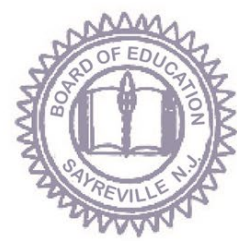

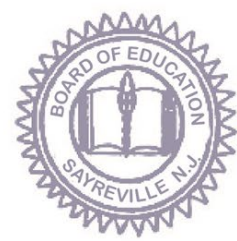




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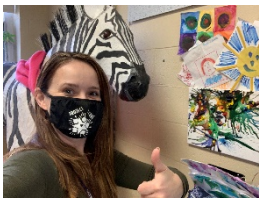
