September 14, 2020

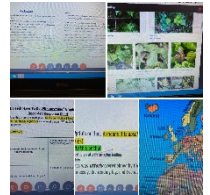
Good morning Sayreville. I hope you had a pleasant weekend. This week will be the first full week of instruction of the 2020-21 school year.

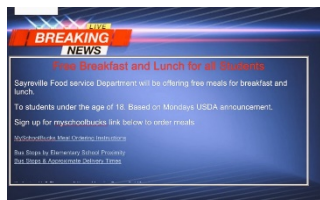

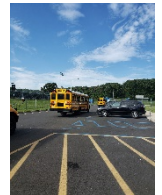


Sayreville BOE Meeting
