Talk Sup Week 6 Review and Preview

October 12, 2020

Good morning Sayreville. I hope you had a pleasant weekend. Please remember that **today**, **Monday**, **October 12**, **2020**, there will be <u>no</u> **teacher office hours** because our faculty will be participating in professional development.



As noted in last week's edition, this past Tuesday we began performing in-person instruction in Phase 2a for all preschool students and students with disabilities in all our Multiple Disabilities (MD) classrooms, along with those in our elementary (K-5) Behavioral Disabilities self-contained classrooms. We will continue with our plan to expand in-person instruction for these students in Phase 2b this week on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday. Furthermore, we have decided to



move forward with in-person instruction for students in kindergarten and first grade in Phase 2a on Tuesday, October 20th for Cohort A and Thursday, October 22nd for Cohort B and then in Phase 2b the week of October 26th on Monday and Thursday for Cohort B and Tuesday and Friday for Cohort A. Finally, beginning on October 19th, we will start in-person speech and language therapy.

As I reported to our community in a broadcast email last week, a staff member from Leading Edge, our childcare patron at Samsel tested positive for COVID-19. Since the report of the infection, the district has been working with Leading Edge, along with the NJDOH to conduct the required contact tracing so that any staff member or child who is determined to have been in "close contact" with the staff member, quarantines for 14 days. The program will reopen today for the "noncontact" students. However, the students determined to have been in close contact have been notified that they are prohibited from attending our schools for childcare and/or in-person instruction until October 21, 2020.
