Talk Sup Week 26 Review and PreviewMarch 9, 2020

Good morning Sayreville! I hope you had a relaxing and enjoyable weekend. Welcome to another edition of *Talk Sup Review and Preview*. Please remember that we will **dismiss all students early this afternoon.** Also, please note that **3<sup>rd</sup> Marking Period Progress Reports** for students in **grades 6-12** will be populated in Oncourse Connect **tomorrow afternoon.** 

As you probably already know, last Thursday the district received guidance from the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) on the requirements for public health-related school closures should the Coronavirus spread throughout our community. According to the information we received, since schools may be directed to close preemptively or reactively by the New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH) and/or the NJDOE, we were instructed to begin making plans for what to do if we are directed to close schools or cancel events. Furthermore, we were informed by the NJDOE that since the NJDOH has identified school closure as a potential pandemic strategy to limit transmission of a contagion within a community, in the event that we are directed to institute a public health-related closure, we will be permitted to utilize home instruction to provide instructional services to all students impacted. While the home instruction services must be guided by New Jersey Administrative Code, it can include online instruction and/or any other means developed by our district to meet the needs of the students affected. Moreover, we were informed that any day in which students impacted by a public health-related closure have access to home instruction services provided consistent with the previously mentioned guidance, the days will count as actual school days in compliance with the New Jersey statutory 180-day requirement. Finally, the memo directed school districts to prepare for submission to the NJDOE school health-related closure preparedness plans to provide home instruction in the event of a public health-related school closure.

Thus, late last week our administrators began the development of Sayreville's school health-related closure preparedness plan, which will be included in our existing Pandemic Plan. In addition, rather than participating in the professional development previously planned for today's half day of school, our administrators will review our school health-related closure preparedness plan with our staff and will provide them with an opportunity to either receive training on the software that we will utilize in the plan or begin making their own preparations. In addition, later this week, our Technology Department will be requesting that all parents complete an online survey to determine the technology needs of our student households, particularly if they have wifi or an educational device to access our home instruction software. In such cases, preparations will be made to provide students in such households with paper packets of work. Department took 70 juniors to the Woodbridge College Fair. In the classrooms, Mr. Cicciari provided his Physics class students a tutorial on







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

If you did not have a chance to attend the Board of Education Business Meeting held on Tuesday, March 3<sup>rd</sup>, here is what you missed. During the meeting, the Board of Education (BOE) and Central Administration were joined by about two dozen 5<sup>th</sup> graders from SUES as part of

the annual "Let the Children Lead" program. During this very popular and unique activity, the 5<sup>th</sup> grade students who participated actually applied to perform in the capacity of a specific board of education member or

administrator. Thus, except for a few occasions, the 5<sup>th</sup> grade representatives for each, including Ms. Coglianese, Principal of SUES and Mr. Tola, Assistant Principal of SUES, voted and commented publicly on behalf of the BOE member or administrator who they represented.

During the presentation portion of the meeting, Ms. Magistro, Supervisor of Elementary School



Instruction, and her adorable special guest Jiji gave a brief presentation on ST Math. In addition, the students representing each BOE member and administrator shared their thoughts on the upcoming referendum and whether climate control would be something that they would desire in their classroom and school. The Board then moved the action items from the Superintendent's

Among other motions, on the Vision 2030 Finance and Infrastructure portion of the agenda, the Board retroactively awarded several quoted bus route packages, previously performed by Durham School Services, to Jays Bus Service. In addition, it awarded a recent request for proposal for scoreboard advertising services to Side Effects, Inc. for a term of April 1, 2020 through March 31, 2025. On the Governance portion of the agenda, the BOE approved a revision to the previously approved 2021-22 School District Calendar. To see it, click <u>here</u>. It also approved the 2020-21 SEA Full-Time Technician Holiday Schedule. Finally, on the Personnel portion of the agenda, as well as other motions, the Board of Education approved motions to hire new certificated and non-certificated staff, and to transfer a non-certificated staff member for the 2019-20 school year.

During the public comment portions of the meeting, two parents and a non-resident of Sayreville questioned and expressed their concern about the absence of Mr. Ciak and his connection to the criminal matter recently reported about a middle school teacher. In response to this, some parents expressed bewilderment and frustration over why such comments would be made during this very special meeting, which had been scheduled for quite some time and had taken place for the past 16 years. Likewise, during open BOE discussions, Mrs. Kenney reviewed what was discussed during the last BOE Student Achievement Committee Meeting. Likewise, Mrs. Bloom reviewed news from the Middlesex County School Boards Association.









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The next meeting will be on **Tuesday, March 17<sup>th</sup>**. During this meeting, the Board will vote on the Preliminary 2020-21 School district Budget. In addition, during the presentation portion of the meeting, the BOE will recognize and honor the SWMHS Girls Bowling Team for their GMC White Division and State Championships. Likewise, it will do the same for the SWMHS Boys and Girls Indoor Track Teams, as well as the Wrestling Team, all of which won GMC White Division Championships.
