Talk Sup Week 25 Review and Preview March 2, 2020

Good morning Sayreville! I hope you had a relaxing and enjoyable weekend. Welcome to another edition of *Talk Sup Review and Preview*.

Last Tuesday evening the Sayreville Board of Education met during a special meeting in order to conduct a Breach of Contract Hearing on several Durham School Services bus routes. Immediately following the hearing, the BOE decided to terminate the following packaged bus routes: SMS 11 and Arleth Yellow, SUES 13 and Eisenhower 3, SUES 6 and Arleth White, and SMS 21 and Eisenhower 6. Likewise, during the next BOE Meeting tomorrow evening, it will be asked to retroactively award those routes to Jays Bussing effective today (March 2nd).



As I reported to you in a recent email, the district has been and will continue to take all precautionary measures to prevent our students and staff from being infected by the Coronavirus. We will be taking extra measures to disinfect all surfaces and will even be spraying each classroom after school in order to further disinfect them. We have also ordered special wipes so that our students and staff can disinfect technology devices without harming hem or the devices. In addition, we will ask our teachers, particularly in the elementary schools, to include handwashing time in student schedules. If necessary, each school will identify and designate a "sick room" in order to separate students who are ill from areas used

by those who are well. Finally, we develop and implement systems for accounting for and reporting students and staff ill with either the flu or the Coronavirus.

However, we are also asking for the cooperation of all school community members by exercising and reminding students to apply the following New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH) precautionary measures: **cover mouths when coughing and sneezing with a tissue or toilet paper, or by doing such into a bent elbow; wash hands frequently, especially before and after eating and after using the restroom; keep objects, especially fingers, out of and away from mouths, noses, and eyes; and remove phones and electronic devices from places where people eat. Lastly, we are asking members of our school community to stay home or keep your children home if you or they are demonstrating flulike symptoms, especially the following: dry cough, fever and/or chills, shortness of breath, and gastrointestinal distress**; and do not return or send children back to school until the symptoms, particularly fever and/or chills, have abated for **24 hours**. 
