

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If you did not have a chance to attend the Board of Education (BOE) Business Meeting held on Tuesday, January 21st, here is what you missed. After Stephen Farley, Student Council Representative to the BOE from SWMHS, and Maeve Witte, the SMS Representative, provided their student activity summaries for each school, the district resumed publicly reviewing and discussing the 2020-21 School District Budget with the following

The Board then moved the action items from the Superintendent's Report onto the Board Agenda and approved all of them. To see the Agenda click here. To see the Agenda click here. Among other motions, on the Vision 2030 Finance and Infrastructure portion of the agenda, the Board awarded a bid for security vestibule upgrades at the Arleth, Eisenhower, Truman and Wilson Elementary Schools to The G. Meyer Group as the lowest responsible bidder in the amount of \$901,913, and agreed to withdraw from Capital Reserve \$321,913 to supplement what was previously allocated for these projects in the 2019-20 Budget.

Among other motions, on the Student Achievement portion of the agenda, the Board of Education approved the 2020 Summer Enrichment Program, which will be held Monday through Friday, beginning June 29, 2020 and ending Friday, August 7, 2020 during the hours of 7:45 am - 4:15 pm at the Samsel Upper Elementary School. Likewise, it also approved the 2020 Camp XL Integrated Extended School Year Summer Program, which will be held Monday through Thursday from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm each week at the Samsel Upper Elementary School from July 6, 2020 to August 6, 2020. On the Governance portion of the agenda, along with other motions, the BOE approved a revision to the 2020-21 School District Calendar and the 2021-22 School District Calendar. To see each, click on them. It also approved the 2020-21 Teamsters Local 469 Holiday Schedule.

On the Personnel portion of the agenda, as well as other motions, the Board of Education appointed new certificated and non-certificated staff for the 2019-20 school year and the transfer of a non-certificated staff member for the 2019-20 school year. In addition, the Board approved of teachers to work in the Reaching for the Stars Academy on an as-needed basis for school year 2019-20. Lastly, the BOE suspended with pay a teacher from the Sayreville Middle School.

During the public participation portion of the meeting, two parents expressed their concerns about the recent arrest of a middle school teacher. One of the parents requested that the Superintendent provide more communication to parents about the matter.

During the BOE comment portion of the meeting, Mr. Esposito asked Ms. Hill, Business Administrator, to review what was discussed during the last BOE Finance Committee Meeting. Mr. Callahan, did the same with regard to the last BOE Personnel Committee Meeting. Finally, Mrs. Bloom updated the Board on Middlesex County School Boards Association news.

The next meeting on **Tuesday, March 3rd.** It will be the annual **Let the Children Lead** meeting, in which 5th grade students from SUES represent each BOE member and the administration during the entire public portion of the
